LEAD OPERATOR – WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

The City of Owosso is accepting applications for a Lead Operator in the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The plant is a Class A tertiary treatment plant and services the city of Owosso and parts of the surrounding area. Removal is achieved through physical/chemical and attached growth biological means, and disinfection through sodium hypochlorite addition. Solids are dewatered via centrifuge and landfilled. Lead Operator responsibilities include: daily plant process operation including solids processing, maintaining chemical inventories, routine evaluation of plant equipment and processes, assisting with compliance data entry and reporting, and assisting with safety practices development and implementation. The Lead Operator works under the direction of the Plant Superintendent and is responsible for overall supervision of the plant processes and employees in his absence. This is a union (AFSCME) position in a 24 hour operation involving overtime and on-call duties.

A Class B State of Michigan Operator Certification is required, or a Class C license with the ability to get a Class B license within two years. Possession of, or attainment within the probationary period of a State of Michigan commercial driver's license, Group B with air brakes and N-Tank vehicle endorsement is required. The successful applicant will demonstrate an educational background and responsible work experience in order to undertake the above described duties and responsibilities with a minimum of additional training and orientation

The current pay scale for this position is \$17.48 per hour to start, \$17.77 after 6 month probation, and \$20.11 after one year of service, plus other additional compensation including overtime, holiday pay, license bonus, clothing allowance and stand-by pay, plus a benefits package.

The City of Owosso considers all applicants for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, handicap or disability, or status as a Vietnam-era or special disabled veteran in accordance with federal law. The City of Owosso also provides "reasonable accommodation" to qualified individuals with disabilities in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and applicable state and local laws.
