PUBLIC HEARINGS

ORDINANCE AMENDMENT - CHAPTER 38, ZONING

The proposed amendment would change the zoning on the parcel at 120 Michigan Avenue from RM-2, Multiple Family - High Rise District to PUD, Planned Unit Development District.

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment regarding the proposed amendment to Chapter 38, Zoning, Section 38-27, Zoning districts and map.

Assistant City Manager Adam Zettel explained the process for approving a PUD rezoning was more complicated than most rezoning requests due to the fact the site plan for the proposed project is tied directly to the rezoning request. He said the PUD zoning designation was chosen as the set-back requirements for the current RM-2 zoning designation would make redevelopment of the property very difficult. He went on to say that should the Council approve the request before them this evening hearings would be held by both the Planning Commission and the Council to vet the site plan. He further indicated staff was fully supportive of the proposed project and strongly recommended approval of the rezoning request.

Woda Group Senior Vice President of Development P. Craig Patterson was on hand to describe the project and answer any questions. He presented details of the project showing the Council numerous drawings of the proposed development. The intent is to construct an addition to the current structure to house 28 rent subsidized senior living units.

The following people commented regarding the proposed amendment:

Justin Horvath, SEDP president/CEO, indicated the SEDP was very excited about the project hoping to recreate the success of the Woda Group's conversion of the old Durand High School into the Sycamore House senior living facility. He felt the development would be a boon to the downtown community by bringing people into the downtown. He said the Woda Group had a long history of success with similar projects in 13 states. Lastly he noted he supported the rezoning of the property and supports the proposed PILOT.

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, sought clarification on the age requirements for the finished units. It was noted those 55 and older would be eligible with some exceptions to that requirement for those with disabilities.

At the conclusion of the public hearing there was a discussion on the PILOT (payment in lieu of taxes) agreement that was being proposed. It was noted such agreements were common with this type of development. A formal agreement would be presented to Council for approval at a later date.

Various Council members expressed their support for the proposed project.

Whereas, the Council, after due and legal notice, has met and there being no one to be heard, motion by Councilperson Fox that the following ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 738

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 38, ZONING, SECTION 38-27, ZONING DISTRICTS AND MAP, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REZONE A SPECIFIC PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY AND AMEND THE ZONING MAP

WHEREAS, an owner interest in 120 Michigan Avenue, parcel number 050-700-001-008-00, petitioned to rezone this parcel from Multiple Family Residential (RM-2) to Planned Unit Development (PUD) for the purpose of constructing a building addition and using the site for senior housing; and

WHEREAS, the petition includes a development program, supplemental regulations, and a set of conceptual renderings that are officially made a part of the zoning amendment; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission published and mailed notices for the request, held a public hearing on the request, and deliberated on the request; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission found that the proposed ordinance meets the intent and criteria for a zoning amendment as it relates to the master plan and the zoning ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the city staff and planning commission recommend, without reservations or conditions, the rezoning of 120 Michigan Avenue to a PUD; and

WHEREAS, the city council has held a public hearing on this petition; and

WHEREAS, the city council finds that the zoning petition meets the intent and criteria for a zoning map amendment, specifically as it relates to the requirements of Section 38-395.

THEREFORE, THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS, that Chapter 38, Zoning, of the Code of the City of Owosso be amended as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 38, Zoning, of the Code of the City of Owosso, Sec. 38-27, Zoning Districts and Map, reflect the changes as illustrated and attached to the record hereto and filed with the city clerk:

Parcel Number: 050-700-001-008-00 Property Address: 120 Michigan Avenue

Property Description: LOTS 8, 9, 10 & 11 WODDARD SUBDIV BLK 1 A L WILLIAMS ADD

Zoning Designation: From RM-2 To PUD

Section 2. This amendment shall become effective January 27, 2013.

Section 3. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerks' office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Justin Horvath, SEDP president/CEO, invited all present to attend the SEDP annual meeting February 12th at 6:00 pm at the Baker College Welcome Center. He noted the drop in the unemployment rate over the last 3 years, due in part to the SEDP's work.

Tom Manke, owner of the business at 118South Washington Street, expressed his happiness with the decrease in the unemployment rate but asked that everyone keep those still in need in mind. He also expressed his objection to the idea of contracting out for the operation of city utilities saying he questioned whether the water quality would remain as high and whether the communities purchasing water from the city would object to outside control of operations. He asked that Council be cautious in exploring the idea.

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, reported a problem tree in the right-of-way along South M-52 near the base of Gute hill. Staff will look into the matter.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Crawford gave a brief detail of the project status report, noting trouble with the tree trimming service employed by Consumers Energy and the City's recent selection as a case study for an MSU planning practicum class.

Councilperson Fox inquired about the status of the Woodland Trails Condominium situation. It was noted the City was awaiting results from the title company as to potential parties with a legal interest in the unsold lots of the development. Mr. Crawford said he felt if the City could take ownership of the lots they could become a controlling party in the development and thus take over jurisdiction of what is now a private street and utilities allowing for the necessary repairs to take place.

There was a brief discussion regarding the status of the house at 1409 West Main including when remodeling on the home must be completed. It was noted 3-4 months remain on the contract and it was thought the owners of the property were working in concert with the schools in an attempt to provide hands-on experience for the building class at the High School.

Mayor Pro-Tem Popovitch inquired about the MSU practicum class and whether Baker students would also be involved in the analysis of the South Washington Street corridor. It was noted that while Baker does not have a Planning program input from Baker students would be welcome.

Councilperson Erfourth inquired whether the City had received DEQ approval for the splash pad yet. It was noted it had not.

Mayor Frederick noted the City was honored to receive another donation for the Veterans' Memorial at Fayette Square. It is anticipated two additional benches will be installed at the end of spring thanks to this most recent donation.

CONTRACT OPERATION OF UTILITIES

City Manager Crawford noted the Utilities Director had retired as had a number of other key personnel at the water and wastewater facilities and the City was finding it difficult to develop and keep staff members with the proper licensing to run the plants. He indicated one option to consider is contracting an outside company to operate and maintain the plants. He noted that approximately 3000 plants around the country are run by outside service companies and the efficiencies presented by such companies allows for a cost savings. He went on to say he felt this was a reasonable alternative for the City and it was his experience that current employees could be absorbed by other operations or hired by the contractor. He said the next step in the process would be to see if there was any interest from service companies in operating the City's facilities or to replace now vacant positions and keep operations in-house.

Mayor Pro-Tem Popovitch and Councilperson Fox expressed concern with the proposal to contract out for such services. They felt the City's utilities and the employees were one of its best assets and there was concern an outside company would have no loyalty to the City.

Councilperson Bailey inquired whether it would be possible for the City to develop its own regional group to take advantage of economies of scale rather than contracting out.

Mayor Frederick indicated he felt the City could implement a number of things to improve operations at the plants a comment which drew support from other Council members.

There was discussion regarding whether a cost savings could be found in partially closing down the water plant each day, cross training of water plant and wastewater plant employees, investing in training current employees or hiring new employees with the proper certifications, and what options would prove beneficial in the long term.

At the conclusion of the discussion Council dismissed the idea of employing an outside contractor to operate the treatment facilities and directed staff work to train internal candidates and/or recruit outside candidates to replace those lost to retirement and attrition.

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, pointed out there were many people present at the meeting this evening and he encouraged them all to come to future meetings as well. He also suggested citizens keep hydrants and manhole covers free of snow and ice to aid City personnel in the case of an emergency.

The Council briefly recessed at 9:02 p.m. and returned at 9:13 p.m.

RE: Special Assessment – 1064 Tracy Street

In an effort to prevent a situation similar to that of the demolition of the structure at 328 Prindle Street staff is proposing Council proceed with the special assessment process now. If you will recall, the City was unable to recover the cost of demolition at that location because the property had proceeded through the second tax sale and all pending assessments were waived by the State between the time the property was invoiced for the demolition and the time of the special assessment action. Proceeding with the special assessment process will allow the City to immediately attach demolition and administrative costs to the property, costs which will be unable to be waived by the State should the property proceed through the tax sale process in the future. The amount listed for this assessment includes staff time, attorney fees, and the cost of demolition.

Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 1 of the Special Assessment – Hazards and Nuisances process, authorizing a public hearing for February 4, 2013 to gather citizen comment regarding the proposed special assessment of the property at 1064 Tracy Street for costs associated with the altering, repairing, tearing down, abating and removing of hazards and nuisances at that location.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 2013-01 HAZARDS AND NUISANCES

RE: PILOT Ordinance – 120 Michigan Avenue

The Lincoln House project is nearing completion. To refresh your memory, the Woda Group is proposing to reuse the existing Lincoln School, with an expansion that will double the total area of the structure, for 28 senior housing units. The zoning has been approved, and the planning commission has recommended approval of a site plan that the city council is scheduled to review at the February 4th meeting.

There are two other necessary components to the project that require the council's attention before the project is finalized. The first is a resolution of support that I will have available on the 4th, and the second is an amendment to the Payment in Lieu of Taxes Ordinance (PILOT).

A PILOT is a typical request with housing projects that meet a public need for some sort of affordable and/or senior housing component. The project needs approval by the Michigan State Housing Development Authority for low income housing tax credits. These credits provide the financial assistance that enables the provision of affordable rents. In order to qualify for such credits the city needs to consider a PILOT for this project.

This means that the owner will pay the city a sum that is calculated based upon the project rents, less utilities, instead of paying real property taxes. The difference in what this amount is compared to projected taxes is not known at this time, but my educated guess is that the PILOT will be about $1/3^{rd}$ of a normal tax payment, totaling \approx \$13,500. This payment would be distributed to taxing entities in the same manner as a tax payment.

The PILOT proposed is very reasonable. It will last only as long as the credits and affiliated rent controls are in place, and it will amount to 10% of the total of all shelter rents less provided utilities. To put this in perspective, the current PILOT that the city has for Kona Villa is set at 4% and the recent project in Durand (The Sycamore House) is set at 3%.

To recap, the project owner is requesting a PILOT as drafted in the attached ordinance. I recommend we move forward with this in expedited fashion and set a public hearing for February 4, 2013. Unfortunately (not unfortunate for me), I will be in Florida during this hearing, but I do not see any issues with the ordinance as long as it is approved as to form by the city attorney.

RESOLUTION NO.

TO CONDUCT THE FIRST READING AND SET A PUBLIC HEARING FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 32 TAXATION OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR A PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES FOR THE LINCOLN HOUSE PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Woda Group, also known as the Lincoln House LDHA Limited Partnership, has proposed a 28 unit low income housing development that is to be targeted towards seniors; and

WHEREAS, the project is located at 120 Michigan Avenue, parcel number 050-700-001-008-00, at the corner of Michigan Avenue and Clinton Streets, partially within the former Lincoln School; and

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso 2012 Master Plan explicitly indicates that this property and structure would be ideally reused as senior housing; and

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso City Council has approved the rezoning of this parcel to PUD and subsequently approved the final site plan for the development; and

WHEREAS, the rents for the housing will be controlled for the purpose of creating affordable low in come housing for seniors, thereby reducing property revenues; and

WHEREAS, the reuse of this vacant structure and the housing of senior citizens near the downtown has a recognized public purpose.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS that Chapter 32, Taxation, of the City of Owosso city code be amended as follows:

SECTION 1. REPEAL. That Sections 32-36 through 32-42 of the *Code of Ordinances*, which read as follows, shall be repealed:

Sec. 32-36. - Preamble.

It is acknowledged that it is a proper public purpose of the state and its political subdivisions to provide housing for its citizens of low income and to encourage the development of such housing by providing for a service charge in lieu of property taxes in accordance with the state housing development authority act of 1966, Act No. 346 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1966 (MCL 125.1401 et seq., MSA 16.114(1) et seq.). The city is authorized by the act to establish or change the service charge to be paid in lieu of taxes by any or all classes of housing exempt from taxation under the act at any amount it chooses not to exceed the taxes that would be paid but for the act. It is further acknowledged that such housing for persons of low income is a public necessity, and as the city will be benefitted and improved by such housing, the encouragement of the same by providing certain real estate tax exemption therefor is a valid public purpose; further, that the continuance of the provisions of this article for tax exemption and the service charge in lieu of taxes during the periods hereinafter contemplated are essential to the determination of economic feasibility of housing developments which are constructed and financed in reliance thereon. The city acknowledges that Owosso Limited Dividend Housing Association (a sponsor) has offered subject to receipt of a mortgage loan from the authority, to erect, own and operate a housing development identified as Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618 on certain property located at (see legal description on file with the city clerk) in the city to serve persons of low income, and

that the sponsor has offered to pay the city on account of the development an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all taxes.

Sec. 32-37. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Act means the state housing development authority act, being Act No. 346 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1966 (MCL 125.1401 et seq., MSA 16.114(1) et seq.), as amended.

Authority means the state housing development authority.

Contract rents are defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in regulations promulgated pursuant to the U.S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

Housing development means a development which contains a significant element of housing for persons of low income and such elements of other housing, commercial, recreational, industrial, communal, and educational facilities as the authority determines improve the quality of the development as it relates to housing for persons of low income.

Mortgage loan means a loan to be made by the authority to the sponsor for the construction and permanent financing of the housing development.

Sponsor means persons or entities which have applied to the authority for a mortgage loan to finance a housing development.

Utilities mean fuel, water, sanitary sewer service and/or electrical service which are paid by the development.

Sec. 32-38. - Class of housing developments.

It is hereby determined that the class of housing developments to which the tax exemption shall apply and for which a service charge shall be paid in lieu of such taxes shall be multiple dwellings for the elderly, which are financed or assisted pursuant to the act. It is further determined that Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618 is of this class.

Sec. 32-39. - Establishment of annual service charge.

The housing development identified as Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618 and the property on which it shall be constructed shall be exempt from all property taxes from and after the commencement of construction. The city, acknowledging that the sponsor and the authority have established the economic feasibility of the housing development in reliance upon the enactment and continuing effect of this article and the qualification of the housing development for exemption from all property taxes and a payment in lieu of taxes as established herein, and in consideration of the sponsor's offer, subject to receipt of a mortgage loan from the authority, to construct, own and operate the housing development, hereby agrees to accept payment of an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all property taxes. The annual service charges shall be equal to four (4) percent of the difference between contract rents actually collected and utilities.

Sec. 32-40. - Contractual effect.

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 15a(5) of the Act (MCL 125.1415a(5), MSA 16.114(15a)(5)), to the contrary, a contract between the city and the sponsor with the authority as third part beneficiary thereunder, to provide tax exemption and accept payments in lieu thereof as previously described is effected by enactment of this article.

Sec. 32-41. - Service charge.

The service charge in lieu of taxes as determined hereunder shall be payable in the same manner as general property taxes are payable to the city except that the annual payment shall be paid on or before March thirty-first of the following year.

Sec. 32-42. - Duration.

Pursuant to section 15a(3) of the Act (MCL 125.1415a(3), MSA 16.114(15a)(3)), [of] this article shall remain in effect and shall not terminate so long as the mortgage loan remains outstanding and unpaid or the authority has any interest in the property.

SECTION 2. NAME. The amended Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "City of Owosso Payment in Lieu of Taxes Ordinance."

SECTION 3. ADDITION. That new Sections 32-36 through 32-42 which read as follows, shall be adopted:

Sec. 32-36. - Preamble.

It is acknowledged that it is a proper public purpose of the State of Michigan and its political subdivisions to provide housing for its elderly citizens of low income or citizens of low income and to encourage the development of such housing by providing for a service charge in lieu of property taxes in accordance with the State Housing Development Authority Act of 1966 (1966 PA 346, as amended, MCLA 125.1401 et seq; MSA 116.114(1) et seq). The City is authorized by this Act to establish or change the service charge to be paid in lieu of taxes by any or all classes of housing exempt from taxation under this Act at any amount it chooses not to exceed the taxes that would be paid but for this Act.

It is further acknowledged that such housing for elderly persons of low income and person of low income is a public necessity, and as the City will be benefited and improved by such housing, the encouragement of the same by providing certain real estate tax exemption for such housing is a valid public purpose; further, that the continuance of the provisions of this Ordinance for tax exemption and the service charge in lieu of taxes during the periods contemplated in this Ordinance are essential to the determination of economic feasibility of housing developments which are constructed and financed in reliance on such Ordinance and service charge.

The city further acknowledges that Owosso Limited Dividend Housing Association (a sponsor) has offered subject to receipt of a mortgage loan from the authority, to erect, own and operate a housing development identified as Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618 on certain property located at (see legal description on file with the city clerk) in the city to serve persons of low income, and that the sponsor has offered to pay the city on account of the development an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all taxes.

The city further acknowledges that Lincoln House LDHA Limited Partnership (a sponsor) has offered subject to receipt of Low Income Housing Tax Credits from the authority, to erect, own and operate a housing development identified as the Lincoln House on certain property located at 120 Michigan Avenue in the city to serve elderly persons of low income, and that the sponsor has offered to pay the city on account of the development an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all taxes.

Sec. 32-37. - Definitions.

Authority means the Michigan State Housing Development Authority.

Act means the State Housing Development Authority Act, being Public Act 346 of 1966, of the State of Michigan, as amended.

Annual Shelter Rents means the total collections during an agreed annual period from all occupants of a housing development representing rents or occupancy charges exclusive of charges for gas, electricity, heat or other utilities furnished to the occupants.

Contract Rents are as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in regulations promulgated pursuant to Section 8 of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended.

Housing Development means a development which contains a significant element of housing for elderly persons of low income or persons of low income and such elements of other housing, commercial, recreational, industrial, communal, and educational facilities as the Authority determines improve the quality of the development as it relates to housing for persons of low income.

HUD means the Department of Housing and Urban Development of the United States Government. (Delete if inapplicable.)

Elderly Persons means a family where the head of household is 62 years of age or older or a single person who is 62 years of age or older, or as otherwise defined by MSHDA.

Elderly Persons of Low Income means elderly persons who meet the eligibility criteria set by the Authority and/or federal government.

Persons of Low Income means persons and families eligible to move into a Housing Development.

Mortgage Loan means a loan to be made by the Authority or Farmers Home Administration or the Department of Housing and Urban Development to the Sponsor for the construction and permanent financing of the Housing Development or a Mortgage loan insured by HUD.

Sponsor means persons or entities which have applied to either the Authority for a Mortgage Loan to finance a Housing Development or to another governmental entity for a federally-aided loan, as defined by the Act.

Utilities mean fuel, water, sanitary sewer service and/or electrical service which are paid by the Housing Development.

Sec. 32-38. - Class of Housing Developments.

It is determined that the class of Housing Developments to which the tax exemption shall apply and for which a service charge shall be paid in lieu of such taxes shall be multiple dwellings for elderly persons of low income or persons of low income which are financed or assisted by the Authority or which are Federally Aided, as defined in the Act. It is determined that Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618 and the Lincoln House are of this class.

Sec. 32-39. - Establishment of Annual Service Charge for Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618.

The housing development identified as Owosso Mixed, MSHDA #618 and the property on which it shall be constructed shall be exempt from all property taxes from and after the commencement of construction. The city, acknowledging that the sponsor and the authority have established the economic feasibility of the housing development in reliance upon the enactment and continuing effect of this article and the qualification of the housing development for exemption from all property taxes and a payment in lieu of taxes as established herein, and in consideration of the sponsor's offer, subject to receipt of a mortgage loan from the authority, to construct, own and operate the housing development, hereby agrees to accept payment of an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all property taxes. The annual service charges shall be equal to four (4) percent of the difference between contract rents actually collected and utilities.

Sec. 32-40. - Establishment of Annual Service Charge for Lincoln House.

Housing Developments for elderly persons of low income or persons of low income and the property on which they shall be constructed shall be exempt from all property taxes from and after the commencement of construction. The City, acknowledging that the Sponsor and the Authority, in the case of a Sponsor receiving a Mortgage Loan from the Authority, have established the economic feasibility of the Housing Development in reliance upon the enactment and continuing effect of this Ordinance and the qualification of the Housing Developments for exemption from all property taxes and a payment in lieu of taxes as established in this Ordinance, will accept payment of an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all property taxes. The annual service charge shall be equal to 10% of the difference between the Annual Shelter Rent for Authority-aided housing developments actually collected and utilities

Sec. 32-41. - Payment of Service Charge.

The service charge in lieu of taxes as determined under this Ordinance shall be payable in the same manner as general property taxes are payable to the City except that the annual payment shall be paid on or before March 31st of each year.

Sec. 32-42. - Duration.

The tax exempt status of a Housing Development approved for such status by the City Council shall remain in effect and shall not terminate so long as the Mortgage Loan for such Housing Development remains outstanding and unpaid, as long as the property is subject to restrictive rents in compliance with the Low Income Housing Tax Credit program administered by MSHDA, or for such period as the Authority or other governmental entity has any interest in the property; provided, the construction of such Housing Development

commences within two years from the effective date the City Council approves the Housing Development for tax exempt status as provided in this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. The various sections and provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be severable, and should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any section or provision of this Ordinance other than the section or provision so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 5. INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective 20 days after passage.

SECTION 7. AVAILABILITY. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerks' office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

SECTION 8. PUBLIC HEARING. A public hearing is set for Monday, February 4, 2013 at approximately 7:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers to hear citizen comment regarding the proposed amendment.
