PARKINSON'S AWARENESS MONTH

Mayor Frederick presented the following proclamation of the Mayor's Office declaring the month of April 2012 as Parkinson's Awareness Month in the City of Owosso to Karen Prussner of the Owosso Parkinson's Support Group.

A PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF THE CITY OF OWOSSO, MICHIGAN PROCLAIMING APRIL 2012 AS PARKINSON'S AWARENESS MONTH IN THE CITY OF OWOSSO

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a chronic, progressive neurological disease that causes

motor system disorders; and

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease affects nearly 35,000 in the State of Michigan and its

prevalence continues to rise significantly with increasing age; and

WHEREAS, a local support group, the Owosso Parkinson's Support Group, has been meeting

for over twenty years in an effort to provide education, support and fellowship to

those affected by this frustrating disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Benjamin R. Frederick, Mayor of the City of Owosso, Michigan, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2012 as Parkinson's Awareness Month in the City of Owosso, Michigan and do hereby encourage all citizens of this community to acknowledge and support the Owosso Parkinson's Support Group and their activities to inform and serve the citizens of our community because their services make a difference.

Proclaimed this 2nd day of April, 2012.

Ms. Prussner detailed the history of the Owosso support group and read aloud a proclamation of the Governor's Office declaring April 2012 as Parkinson's Awareness Month in the State of Michigan.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

ORDINANCE AMENDMENT - CHAPTER 33, TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES

The proposed amendment would allow the City to assess stronger penalties for drivers with a blood alcohol content in excess of 0.17% in accordance with Michigan's new "Super Drunk" law.

A public hearing was to receive citizen comment regarding the proposed addition of Section 33-5 to Chapter 33, Traffic and Motor Vehicles.

There were no citizen comments.

Whereas, the Council, after due and legal notice, has met and there being no one to be heard, motion by Councilperson Eveleth that the following ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 730

AN ORDINANCE TO ADD CODE SECTION 33-5 ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE MOTOR VEHICLE CODE SECTION RELATING TO DRIVING WITH A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT OVER 0.17%

AN ORDINANCE to add Section 33-5 to Chapter 33, Traffic and Motor Vehicles, to adopt by reference the Motor Vehicle Code section related to driving with a blood alcohol content over 0.17% and further define the penalties for offenses of the Code.

WHEREAS, the state legislature adopted a "Super Drunk" law in 2011 establishing more stringent penalties for operating a vehicle with a blood alcohol level over 0.17%; and

WHEREAS, the city of Owosso is chartered under the Home Rule Cities Act which limits the penalties for such offenses to those less than that defined by the new state law; and

WHEREAS, in late February 2012 the state legislature amended the Home Rule Cities Act to allow cities chartered under the Act to levy the more severe penalties as appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the city of Owosso desires to punish offenders appropriately, as established by state law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the city council of the city of Owosso that Section 33-5 be added to the Code of the city of Owosso, adopting by reference the Motor Vehicle Code section relating to driving with a blood alcohol content over 0.17% and establishing more stringent penalties for offenses of the Ordinance as follows:

THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 33-5 of the Owosso City Code shall be added to state:

Sec. 33-5. Home Rule Cities Act, amendment and revisions adopted.

- (1) Pursuant to Act 1909 PA 279 as amended by Act 2012 PA 7; Section 625(1)(c) of the Michigan Vehicle Code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.625, is hereby adopted by reference. Violation of this ordinance is punishable by one (1) or more of the following:
 - (i) community service for not more than 360 hours;
 - (ii) imprisonment for not more than 180 days;
 - (iii) a fine of not less than \$200.00 or more than \$700.00.

Section 2: Inspection.

This Ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the City Clerk's Office Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Section 3. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect April 22, 2012.

CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Marsha Ladd, Parks & Recreation Commissioner, indicated she was incredibly excited to see the playscape come to fruition after almost 3 years of work. She said she was also pleased to see other parks items on the agenda.

Mayor Pro-Tem Popovitch asked that staff ensure that those organizing the Memorial 5K not mark the streets with permanent paint again this year. She also asked if the City had plans to clean up the parking lot near the apartment complex on Curwood Castle Drive. It was noted plans for clean-up are in place.

Councilperson Fox gave an update on the status of the Fireman's Memorial saying Trust Thermal had been contacted and they have no problem sharing the property immediately adjacent to theirs to allow room for the memorial. He also indicated new architectural drawings for the structure to house the memorial, specific to the property in question, were completed.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Donald D. Crawford detailed the Project Status Report.

Mayor Frederick said he was pleased that staff had worked to resolve the issue with the Woodland Trails sewer system.

There was discussion regarding the removal of trees in the City right of way and lighting issues in the block 26 parking lot.

Mayor Frederick said he had received an inquiry whether a community garden could be placed on the old Redmonds site. It was noted that contamination remains on that site and a garden would not be recommended.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 38 ZONING OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REZONE A SPECIFIC PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY AND AMEND THE ZONING MAP

Whereas, the city council of the city of Owosso received a petition from a land owner of real property identified as 1484 West King Street, parcel 050-450-000-039-00, lots 36, 39, & 40 of the Oak Grove Addition to rezone the parcel from I-1 Light Industrial to R-1 One Family Residential.

Whereas, the city council referred the request to the planning commission, and the planning commission subsequently published the request, held a public hearing on the request, and deliberated on the request;

Whereas, the city staff and planning commission recommend, without reservations or conditions, the rezoning of 1484 West King Street as petitioned;

Therefore, Be It Resolved, that Chapter 38, Zoning Code of the City of Owosso be amended as follows:

THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Chapter 38, Zoning Code of the City of Owosso Sec. 38-27 Zoning Districts and Map reflect the following change to be noted on the official map and filed with the city clerk:

Indicate a zoning classification of R-1 One Family Residential for 1484 West King, parcel 050-450-000-039-00.

- Section 2. This amendment shall become effective 20 days after passage.
- Section 3. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerks' office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
- Section 4. A public hearing to receive citizen comment regarding the proposed rezoning will

be held Monday, April 16, 2012 at or about 7:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 301 West Main Street, Owosso, Michigan.

PURCHASE AUTHORIZATION – BENTLEY PARK PLAYSCAPE

Council expressed their universal excitement at seeing this project move to fruition.

Motion by Councilperson Erfourth to approve the purchase of a playscape system for Bentley Park in the amount of \$79,963.23 and further approve payment up to the quoted amount as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 22-2012

BENTLEY PLAYSCAPE PURCHASE

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso Parks and Recreation Commission, with the approval of the city council, has been planning and fundraising for a playscape at Bentley Park; and

WHEREAS, the fundraising for this playscape is substantially complete; and

WHEREAS, the parks and recreation commission desires to install the playscape on June 14-16th of 2012 using the 'community build' concept; and

WHEREAS, a quote that is at or below General Services Administration contract pricing has been delivered to the city for immediate purchase and delivery of the playscape; and

WHEREAS, the purchasing ordinance provides for an exception to competitive bidding when a purchase is made with another governmental unit and Council determines the public interest is best served.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT City of Owosso City Council hereby approves the new purchase of the playscape equipment as quoted by Miracle of Michigan in the amount of \$79,963.23 and directs staff to make payment so that a further discount may be realized, subject to confirmation of certain conditions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the city council hereby appropriates \$30,000 from fund balance toward this project, including phases I and II, and directs staff to amend the capital outlay line item in the recreation budget for fiscal year 2011-2012 as necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the council hereby directs staff to engage in planning efforts for the community build that is to occur between June 14-16th and to permit or limit any and all ancillary activities, site work, and construction in the park as needed; with such construction to occur in an area to be determined by staff in conjunction with the equipment provider, provided the area is in the vicinity described as being 'south of the pavilion, in the eastern side of Bentley Park.'

ROSEVEAR PARK DISC GOLF COURSE ACCEPTANCE

ROSEVEAR DISC GOLF DONATION

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso Parks and Recreation Commission has been approached by a group of citizens that desire to place a disc golf course in Rosevear Park and the property adjacent to the park (under private ownership and in another municipality); and

WHEREAS, the parks and recreation commission has reviewed this request and investigated alternatives and best practice; and

WHEREAS, the parks and recreation commission believes that such a use would be a valuable asset to the park, the neighborhood, and the community; and

WHEREAS, the citizen group intends to raise all funds necessary to purchase and install the disc golf course; and

WHEREAS, a tentative layout of two 'holes' has been proposed for Rosevear Park and this location should not inhibit current activities; and

WHEREAS, such a feature would become property of the city to own, operate, and maintain after installed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT City of Owosso City Council hereby conceptually approves the disc golf course, subject to further review on apparatus composition, operation, and location.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the city council hereby accepts the donation of such a feature and permits the parks and recreation commission and/or its partners to solicit funds for this project in accordance with city ordinance and policy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the city council requires a formal review of a detailed proposal and a recommendation from the parks and recreation commission before any such facility can be installed.
