Mayor Eveleth led a ceremony recognizing the promotion of Lieutenant Rick Brewbaker to Captain and Firefighter Brian Matthies to Lieutenant.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Rezoning - 912 S. Washington Street

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment regarding the proposal to rezone the parcel located at 912 S. Washington Street from R-1 Single Family Residential District, R-2 Two Family Residential, and B-1 Local Business District to B-1 Local Business District.

The following people commented regarding the proposed rezoning: Kendra Nichols spoke on behalf of Elite Early Learning Center saying the building and the property area has been used as childcare for 20 years.

Justin Horvath, 818 S. Washington Street, is a neighbor and is ok with this.

Councilmember Fox said this change would make the parcel more appropriate for future expansion.

Motion by Councilmember Fox to approve the rezoning of 912 S. Washington Street as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 789

AMENDING CHAPTER 38 ZONING OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REZONE THE PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY AT 912 S. WASHINGTON STREET AND AMEND THE ZONING MAP

WHEREAS, the city of Owosso received a petition from a land owner of real property identified as 912 S. Washington Street, parcel 050-651-039-006-00, LOTS 6 & 7 PART OF LOT 9 BEG 15' $\,$ W

OF SE COR LOT 9 TH E 15' N 30' SW'LY TO POB LOTS 10 11 12 & 13 BLK 39 A L WILLIAMS ADD, INCL VAC N-S ALLEY FROM N LN GUTE ST TO CENTER OF LOTS 9 & 10 to rezone the entire parcel to a B-1 Local Business District, which will eliminate multiple zoning designations of R-1 Single Family Residential District, R-2 Two Family Residential, and B-1 Local Business District currently attached to this parcel; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission published the request, held a public hearing on the request, and deliberated on the request; and

WHEREAS, the city staff and planning commission recommend, without reservations or conditions, the rezoning of parcel 050-651-039-006-00, 912 S. Washington Street from R-1 Single Family Residential District, R-2 Two Family Residential, and B-1 Local Business District to a single zoning designation of B-1 Local Business District; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on the request November 6, 2017, heard all interested persons, and deliberated on the request; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the zoning petition meets the intent and criteria for a zoning map amendment, specifically as it relates to the requirements of Section 38-555 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. OFFICIAL ZONING MAP AMENDMENT. That Chapter 38, Zoning Code of the City of Owosso Sec. 38-27, *Zoning Districts and Map*, reflect the following change to be noted on the official map and filed with the city clerk:

Indicate a zoning classification of B-1 Local Business District for 912 S. Washington Street, parcel 050-651-039-006-00.

SECTION 2. AVAILABILITY. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerk's office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective November 27, 2017.

CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Tom Manke, Owosso Township resident, spoke of the bad water report submitted to the State 4 years ago.

Christina Rosenberger-Barron spoke about PFLAG (Parents & Friends of Lesbians and Gays). She explained the program and the support for lesbians and gays.

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, wanted to publicly thank Councilmember Fox for his letter in the paper regarding the school bond issue.

Shiawassee County Commissioner Dan McMaster gave updates on the dispatch center and plans to move in January 1. Cosmetic work on the jail is being completed and the heating issue is being investigated. Budget workshops are now in progress and a new director of the Veteran's Affairs Office will be coming in soon.

Justin Horvath, president of the SEDP, said they were working on the assembly of a county-wide grant for \$300,000 to identify and test for potential brownfield redevelopment opportunities and funds for cleanup. He indicated they had received an MDOT grant for \$325,000 for the industrial park and two jobs fairs will be held on November 18th for Cargill and Midwest Bus.

In response to Mr. Manke's comments about the water Director of Public Services Glenn Chinavare stated the City is waiting on the DEQ for results of more recent tests.

Councilmember Fox asked Mr. Chinavare about Oliver St. and traffic counts. Mr. Chinavare stated they are still being tested and programmed. No date at this time.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Donald D. Crawford detailed the latest Project Status Report.

Councilmember Fox asked if there were going to be bike paths on Oliver Street from Adams to Gould. Mr. Crawford stated that is being analyzed at this time.

Approve Change Order Nos. 1 & 2 to 2018 Street Program Engineering Services Contract with Fleis & Vandenbrink Engineering, Inc. adding \$32,500.00 for the survey of streets for the 2019 Street Program, adding \$5,000.00 for additional design services for the rehabilitation of Williams Street, and authorizing payment to the contractor upon satisfactory completion of the work or a portion thereof as detailed below:

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, approved a contract with Fleis & Vandenbrink Engineering Inc. on July 3, 2017 for Engineering Survey and Design Services for the 2018 Street Program in the amount of \$251,000.00; and

WHEREAS the city requests additional services of the consultant to provide preliminary survey and design services beyond the original contractual scope of services; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

FIRST:

The City of Owosso has theretofore determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest to amend the contract with Fleis & Vandenbrink Engineering Inc. for a cost to the City of Owosso of \$32,500.00 for surveying of proposed 2019 Street Rehabilitation projects, and \$5,000.00 for additional design services to extend the 2018 rehabilitation of Williams Street from N. Water to N. Washington Street.

SECOND: The mayor and city clerk are requested and authorized to sign the amended

contract between the City of Owosso, Michigan and Fleis & Vandenbrink, Inc.

THIRD: The Accounts Payable department is authorized to make payment up to the

amended amount of \$288,500.00 to Fleis & Vandenbrink Engineering, Inc. upon

successful completion of stated work.

WHEREAS, the existing Pump/Motor/VFD turn-key units has expired their useful service life, and determined to require replacement with more efficient and properly sized unit equipment, and
