PROCLAMATIONS / SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Parkinson's Awareness Month

Mayor Eveleth read aloud the following proclamation of the Mayor's Office declaring the month of April 2018 as Parkinson's Awareness Month in the City of Owosso:

A PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF THE CITY OF OWOSSO, MICHIGAN PROCLAIMING APRIL 2018 AS PARKINSON'S AWARENESS MONTH IN THE CITY OF OWOSSO

- WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a chronic, progressive neurological disease that causes motor system disorders; and
- WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease affects nearly 35,000 in the State of Michigan and its prevalence continues to rise significantly with the increasing age of the Baby Boom generation; and
- WHEREAS, a local support group, the Owosso Parkinson's Support Group, has been meeting for over twenty-seven years in an effort to provide education, support and fellowship to those affected by this frustrating disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Christopher T. Eveleth, Mayor of the City of Owosso, Michigan, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2018 as Parkinson's Awareness Month in the City of Owosso, Michigan and do hereby encourage all citizens of this community to acknowledge and support the Owosso Parkinson's Support Group and their activities to inform and serve the citizens of our community because their services make a difference.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Special Assessment District No. 2018-04

Howard Street from Washington Street to 150' east of Park Street

Prior to the public hearing Utilities Director Glenn M. Chinavare briefly detailed the proposed project saying the street would be fully reconstructed including the installation of new watermain, new storm sewer lines, and new curb and gutter.

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment regarding Resolution No. 3 for proposed Special Assessment District No. 2018-04 for Howard Street from Washington Street to 150' east of Park Street for street reconstruction.

The following person commented prior to the meeting regarding the proposed project:

Rodney Rust, owner of the property between the rail road tracks and Howard Street, via telephone, said he objects to the proposed project for two reasons: 1. his proposed assessment is several times the price he paid for the property; 2. the new curb and gutter would make it impossible for him to continue to use his lot for the purpose in which he purchased it (semi parking).

The following people commented during the meeting regarding the proposed project:

Roger Snyder, representing Rodney Rust, said the property isn't worth the amount that it's being assessed and that if curb and gutter is installed Mr. Rust will be unable to use the property for the purpose in which he purchased it.

Lester Donelson, owner of 515 S. Park Street, said the City has torn up the street, the sidewalk, and his driveway and is now asking him to pay for the repair and that is unfair.

Carl Ludington, owner of 503 S. Washington Street, said he is in favor of the proposed project, the drainage of the area is very poor and this project will fix that problem. He went on to say that he would like to put apartments above his office eventually.

Mayor Eveleth inquired whether curb and gutter would be installed along the north side of the street. City Engineer Randy J. Chesney indicated it would, but it shouldn't interfere with Mr. Rust's use of his property. He went on to say that the purpose of the curb and gutter is to redirect storm water to the storm sewer system and improve the drainage in an area that has had a persistent problem. He said he could work with Mr. Rust to determine where the access points in the curb should be.

In response to Mr. Donelson's comments Utilities Director Chinavare indicated that if City crews damaged the street and/or sidewalk then the City would restore it. He asked that Mr. Donelson contact him to further discuss the issue.

City Engineer Chesney noted that plans for the project include the replacement of driveway approaches and sidewalks at no charge to the property owners.

Mayor Eveleth noted that the purpose of the public hearing this evening was to determine whether the project is necessary and having driven through the area recently he said the project is very necessary and proceeding makes sense.

City Manager Henne instructed the Council that because the property owners placing objections to the project amounted to more than 50% of the cost of the assessment the affirmative vote of at least five members of the Council would be required to move the project forward.

Motion by Councilmember Teich that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLUTION NO. 38-2018

ESTABLISHING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 2018-04 HOWARD STREET, FROM WASHINGTON STREET TO 150' EAST OF PARK STREET FOR STREET RECONSTRUCTION

WHEREAS, the City Council, after due and legal notice, has met and having heard all persons to be affected by the proposed public improvement more particularly hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it advisable and necessary to proceed with said public improvement as more particularly hereinafter described.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Council hereby determines to make and proceed with the following described public improvement and to defray a part or the whole cost, as more particularly hereinafter provided, by special assessment upon the property specially benefited:

HOWARD STREET, A PUBLIC STREET, FROM WASHINGTON STREET TO 150' EAST OF PARK STREET STREET RECONSTRUCTION

2. The City Council hereby approves the plans for the aforesaid public improvement as prepared and presented by the City Manager and determines the estimated cost of said public improvement to be \$311,639.70 and approves said estimated cost and determines that the estimated life of said public improvement is twenty (20) years.

- 3. The City Council determines that of said total estimated cost, the sum of \$56,322.10 be paid by special assessment upon the property specially benefited, as more particularly hereinafter described, and that the sum of \$255,317.60 of said total estimated cost shall be the obligation of the City at large because of benefit to the City at large.
- 4. The City Council hereby designates the following described property as the special assessment district upon which the special assessment shall be levied:

Howard Street, a Public Street, from Washington Street to 150' east of Park Street Street Reconstruction

- 5. The City Assessor shall prepare a special assessment roll including all lots and parcels of land within the special assessment district herein designated, and the Assessor shall assess to each such lot or parcel of land such relative portion of the whole sum to be levied against all lands in the special assessment district as the benefit to such lot or parcel of land bears to the total benefits to all lands in such district.
- 6. When the Assessor shall have completed the assessment roll, he shall file the special assessment roll with the City Clerk for presentation to the City Council.

First Reading & Set Public Hearing – Ordinance Amendment – Chapter 26, Signs. Conduct first reading and set a public hearing for Monday, May 7, 2018 to receive citizen comment on the proposal to amend Chapter 26, <u>Signs</u>, Article IV, *General Provisions*, Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, subsection 1a, *Sign setbacks*, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso to reduce the setback requirement of ten (10) feet from any public right-of-way to five (5) feet as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 39-2018

TO AMEND SECTION 26-19(1)a OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF OWOSSO TO REDUCE SIGN SETBACKS

WHEREAS, subsection *1a. Sign setbacks*, of Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted</u> <u>signs</u>, outlines specific regulations regarding signage and setback requirements; and

WHEREAS, the setback requirements pertaining to public right-of-ways require modification to correct an error made when the ordinance was repealed and replaced in May 2017; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission held a public workshop at their March 26, 2018 regularly scheduled meeting regarding the proposed amendment to Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, subsection *1a. Sign setbacks* in which no citizen comments were voiced or received; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission recommends amending Section 26-19 (1)a to correct the error.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. That subsection *a. Sign setbacks* of Section 26-19(1). <u>General</u> <u>standards for permitted signs</u> of the Owosso City Code be amended to read:

Sec. 26-19. - General standards for permitted signs.

Signs which are permitted as accessory uses serving a commercial or informational purpose may be permitted subject to the requirements of this article; provided, that no such sign shall be erected or altered until approved by the building official/zoning administrator and until a sign permit has been issued pursuant to chapter 26 of the City of Owosso Code of Ordinances.

- (1) Sign setbacks.
 - a. All signs, unless otherwise provided for, shall be set back a minimum of ten feet five (5) feet from any public or private street right-of-way line or access drive in all districts. This distance shall be measured from the nearest edge of the sign, measured at a vertical line perpendicular to the ground to the right-of-way.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. The various sections and provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be severable, and should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any section or provision of this Ordinance other than the section or provision so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed.

SECTION 4. PUBLIC HEARING. A public hearing is set for Monday, May 7, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of hearing citizen comment regarding the proposed amendment to Chapter 26, Signs, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective 20 days after approval.

SECTION 6. AVAILABILITY. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerk's office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Special Assessment District No. 2018-06. Authorize Resolution No. 2 setting a public hearing for Monday, April 16, 2018 for proposed Special Assessment District No. 2018-06 for Stewart Street from Cedar Street to Shiawassee Street for street resurfacing as detailed below:

STEWART STREET FROM CEDAR STREET TO SHIAWASSEE STREET SPECIAL ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION NO. 2

WHEREAS, the City Council has ordered the City Manager to prepare a report for public improvement, more particularly hereinafter described; and

Stewart Street, Public Street, from Cedar Street to Shiawassee Street; Street Resurfacing

WHEREAS, the City Manager prepared said report and the same has been filed with the City Council as required by the Special Assessment Ordinance of the City of Owosso and the Council has reviewed said report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The plans and estimate of cost and the report of the City Manager for said public improvement shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk and shall be available for public examination.
- 2. The City Council hereby determines that the Public Improvement hereinafter set forth may be necessary.
- 3. The City Council hereby approves the estimate of cost of said public improvement to be \$331,305.00 and determines that \$72,902.88 thereof shall be paid by special assessment imposed on the lots and parcels of land more particularly hereinafter set forth, which lots and parcels of land are hereby designated to be all of the lots and parcels of land to be

benefited by said improvements and determines that \$258,402.12 of the cost thereof shall be paid by the City at large because of benefit to the City at large.

- 4. The City Council hereby determines that the portion of the cost of said public improvement to be specially assessed shall be assessed in accordance with the benefits to be received.
- The City Council shall meet at the Owosso City Hall Council Chambers on Monday, April 16, 2018 for the purpose of hearing all persons to be affected by the proposed public improvement.
- 6. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause notice of the time and place of the hearing to be published once in The Argus Press, the official newspaper of the City of Owosso, not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of said hearing and shall further cause notice of said hearing to be sent by first class mail to each owner of property subject to assessment, as indicated by the records in the City Assessor's Office as shown on the general tax roll of the City, at least (10) full days before the time of said hearing, said notice to be mailed to the addresses shown on said general tax rolls of the City.
- 7. The notice of said hearing to be published and mailed shall be in substantially the following form:

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that City Council has caused plans and an estimate of the cost and report for the above described public improvement to be prepared and made by the City Manager and the same is on file with the City Clerk and available for public examination.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the City Council will meet at the Owosso City Hall Council Chambers, Owosso, Michigan at 7:30 o'clock p.m. on Monday, April 16, 2018 for the purpose of hearing any person to be affected by the proposed public improvement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

- FIRST: The city of Owosso has heretofore determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest to contract with Safeway Transport, Inc. for the Cleaning/ Televising/PACP coding of sanitary and storm sewers to evaluate structural condition and to perform system Asset Management as required by the State of Michigan.
- SECOND: The accounts payable department is authorized to submit payment to Safeway Transport, Inc. in the additional amount of \$6,753.00 for sewer services for a total contract amount not to exceed \$241,727.73.
- THIRD: The above expenses shall be paid from account no. 203-463-818.000 local street maintenance funds.

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, has budgeted from the Wastewater Plant Replacement Fund for the repair of a centrifuge drive unit for dewatering process sludge at the Wastewater Treatment Facility, and

WHEREAS, the existing centrifuge drive unit is inoperable due to age and constant use, and is determined to require immediate repair to place back into service. Centrisys Corporation has provided pricing for subsequent repairs at a cost of \$26,556.00, and

WHEREAS, the City Director of Public Services and Utilities has reviewed the necessity for additional repairs, and has verified the repair and rehabilitation requirements to restore the centrifuge drive unit to full operating condition, and recommends authorizing Centrisys Corporation to provide the required repair services in an amount not to exceed \$26,556.00.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

- FIRST: The city of Owosso has heretofore determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest to contract with Centrisys Corporation of Kenosha, Wisconsin for the emergency repair and overhaul services of the centrifuge drive unit for use at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- SECOND: The mayor and/or city clerk are instructed and authorized to sign the purchase services in the amount of \$26,556.00.
- THIRD: The accounts payable department is authorized to submit payment to Centrisys Corporation in an amount not to exceed \$26,556.00 for repair services, plus initial inspection services in the amount of not to exceed \$3,500.00, for a total of \$30,056.00.
- FOURTH: The above expenses shall be paid from account no. 599-901-977.000.

Emergency Services – Sludge Hauling & Processing. WHEREAS, the Wastewater Treatment Facility was unable to process sludge for disposal from January through March of 2018, as the result of an inoperable centrifuge drive unit, requiring sludge hauling services to remove excessive accumulation to another treatment facility for processing; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Services and Utilities has reviewed the necessity for emergency sludge hauling services pending repair of the centrifuge drive unit, and recommends authorizing payment to Young's Environmental Cleanup, Inc. for transporting Owosso sludge to another treatment facility in the amount of \$11,257.50.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

- FIRST: The city of Owosso has heretofore determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest to haul excessive accumulation of sludge to another treatment facility, for processing.
- SECOND: It is further determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest to contract with Young's Environmental Cleanup, Inc. of Flint, Michigan for sludge hauling in the amount of \$11,257.50.
- THIRD: The accounts payable department is authorized to submit payment to Young's Environmental Cleanup, Inc. in the amount of \$11,257.50 for sludge processing services.

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF ADDENDUM NO. 3 TO AN AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES WITH ORCHARD, HILTZ & MCCLIMENT, INC. D/B/A OHM ADVISORS

WHEREAS, the city of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, entered into an agreement with Orchard, Hiltz & McCliment, Inc. d/b/a OHM Advisors by the adoption of Resolution 69-2017 on May 15, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the city has been invited to take part in a grant program to assist in the location, identification, and removal of lead and galvanized water service lines within the city; and

WHEREAS, the city is eligible to receive \$1,000,000.00 through said grant program, but application for the funds, including an engineering proposal, must be received by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality by March 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the city currently holds a contract with OHM Advisors for the provision of engineering services related to the mapping, modeling, and geodatabase management of the water distribution system and is the firm most familiar with the city's water distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the city and utilities director desires to expand the contract to include additional services for performing location/identification/construction management services, in accordance with the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality 2018 Pilot Drinking Water Infrastructure Grant Program to permit the city to apply for said grant funds by the deadline.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the city council of the city of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

FIRST: The city of Owosso has heretofore determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest to waive competitive bidding requirements and expand the contract approved by Resolution 69-2017 on May 15, 2017 with Orchard, Hiltz & McCliment, Inc. d/b/a OHM Advisors to include additional services for the execution of and compliance with the MDEQ 2018 Pilot Drinking Water Infrastructure Grant Program as shown in Attachment A, contingent upon approval of Grant funds by MDEQ.

- SECOND: The accounts payable department is authorized to submit payment to OHM Advisors for professional services in an amount not to exceed \$198,600.00 for engineering services in compliance with the MDEQ 2018 Pilot Drinking Water Infrastructure Grant Program.
- THIRD: The above reimbursements and expenses shall be managed through water revenue account 591-000-539.000 and water capital account 591-901-972.000.

Councilmember Fox took issue with the MLive article that quoted Corunna as having no lead content when they get their water from the City. He said water quality is taken very seriously by the City and he thought the figures quoted were misleading. Mayor Eveleth echoed Mr. Fox's comments saying he felt the article was poorly written and not well researched.
