#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

### <u>Special Assessment District No. 2018-06</u> Stewart Street from Cedar Street to Shiawassee Street

Utilities Director Glenn M. Chinavare briefly detailed the project saying it was a street rehabilitation involving replacement of the pavement and curb & gutter replacement where necessary. He indicated there are no new watermains being installed as a part of this project.

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment regarding Resolution No. 3 for proposed Special Assessment District No. 2018-06 for Stewart Street from Cedar Street to Shiawassee Street for street resurfacing.

There were no citizen comments received prior to, or during the meeting.

Motion by Councilmember Fox that the following resolution be adopted:

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 54-2018**

#### ESTABLISHING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 2018-06 STEWART STREET, FROM CEDAR STREET TO SHIAWASSEE STREET FOR STREET RESURFACING

WHEREAS, the City Council, after due and legal notice, has met and there being no one to be heard regarding the proposed public improvement more particularly hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it advisable and necessary to proceed with said public improvement as more particularly hereinafter described.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Council hereby determines to make and proceed with the following described public improvement and to defray a part or the whole cost, as more particularly hereinafter provided, by special assessment upon the property specially benefited:

STEWART STREET, A PUBLIC STREET, FROM CEDAR STREET TO SHIAWASSEE STREET STREET RESURFACING

- 2. The City Council hereby approves the plans for the aforesaid public improvement as prepared and presented by the City Manager and determines the estimated cost of said public improvement to be \$331,305.00 and approves said estimated cost and determines that the estimated life of said public improvement is twenty (20) years.
- 3. The City Council determines that of said total estimated cost, the sum of \$72,902.88 be paid by special assessment upon the property specially benefited, as more particularly hereinafter described.
- 4. The City Council hereby designates the following described property as the special assessment district upon which the special assessment shall be levied:

Stewart Street, a Public Street, from Cedar Street to Shiawassee Street Street Resurfacing

- 5. The City Assessor shall prepare a special assessment roll including all lots and parcels of land within the special assessment district herein designated, and the Assessor shall assess to each such lot or parcel of land such relative portion of the whole sum to be levied against all lands in the special assessment district as the benefit to such lot or parcel of land bears to the total benefits to all lands in such district.
- 6. When the Assessor shall have completed the assessment roll, he shall file the special assessment roll with the City Clerk for presentation to the City Council.

#### **CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS**

Tom Manke, Owosso Township resident, said he was shocked that Council approved a street project without insisting the water main be replaced as a part of the project. He said the City's water has high lead levels and nothing is being done about it. He said he did not understand why the Council and staff do not care about the health of residents.

Richard Wheeler, 6420 East M21, Corunna, indicated he had been involved in the donation of the Curwood Statue near the Castle and was extremely disappointed that the fishing pole on the statue has not been replaced since it was last vandalized. He wanted to know why an investigation into the vandalism was not underway and why no one was being held accountable for taking care of the statue.

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, commented that in today's world police officers should be mindful of the threat of a bio-chemical attack when they handle unknown substances that could be drugs.

Lon Zimmerman, 590 Hollywood Drive, said he was trying to clean up his sister's yard on Olmstead Street but ran into a roadblock when it came to disposing of the yard waste. He said he had been told that he would be denied entrance to the City's drop-off site if he hauled the waste in his personal truck because he is not a resident of the City. He asked what he would need to bring with him to prove the leaves originated from a property inside the City.

County Commissioner Dan McMaster gave an update on recent issues handled by the Commission including: work continues on the wind turbine debate with another public hearing scheduled for early May, efforts are being made to arrange a partnership between SATA and the County's drug court to transport people to their drug court hearings, the jail will be getting new cameras with a portion of the funding provided by a grant, and corrections are being made to a policy that allowed some employees to be paid for unused vacation time in error.

Duanne Silver said he lives at 134 S. Chipman Street and wanted to know what he needed to do to allow parking in front of his house as it is currently not permitted.

Parks & Recreation Commission Chairman Mike Espich detailed the progress the Commission has made in raising \$30,000 toward a new skate park saying they have to raise an additional \$4,500 before the deadline in two weeks and he asked Councilmembers to approach their constituents for funds to help reach the goal.

Mayor Eveleth addressed several of the issues raised saying that he will check with the Historic Properties Director on recommendations for the Curwood Statue, in regard to the drop-off site he noted that staff will now be checking each vehicle that enters for residency as they have had lots of trouble with inappropriate items being left at the site, and lastly he inquired about the process for changing traffic control orders.

Public Safety Director Lenkart indicated that the process for changing a traffic control order is the approval of a subsequent traffic control order by Council. He said he would consult with the City Engineer first to determine the reasoning for the parking prohibition on Chipman Street.

Mayor Eveleth gave kudos to the Parks & Recreation Commission for their efforts in raising money for a new skate park.

Councilmember Greenway noted that she is the Council representative on the Historical Commission and addressed Mr. Wheeler about the Curwood statue saying it is beautiful and much admired but the Commission finds it difficult to know what to do about the situation. She said the Commission wants to fix it but it continually gets vandalized.

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Councilmember Fox inquired whether the footage from the camera monitoring the statue had been reviewed. Public Safety Director Lenkart indicated that the video of the statue is of poor quality and would require days of man-power to be reviewed.

Councilmember Teich inquired what it would take to get better cameras to watch over the Curwood Statue. Mayor Eveleth said he would be interested in upgrading the cameras as well. City Manager Nathan R. Henne said he had previously gotten a grant for the purchase of upgraded cameras from the City's insurance company, MMRMA, when he was in Springfield and would see if something similar was available for Owosso.

Councilmember Fox also noted that he may have a lead on a developer for the remaining Osburn Lakes properties as well as the property to the south of the development and he encouraged Council to take action on the sale of Osburn Lakes lots at the April 30<sup>th</sup> meeting.

#### **CITY MANAGER REPORT**

City Manager Henne reported that he had spent a significant amount of time over the last week trying to sort out the real estate contract for the sale of lots at Osburn Lakes. He suggested that, despite the tradition to reserve action items for regular meetings, the Council consider adding an item to its April 30<sup>th</sup> agenda to terminate the contract with Century 21-Looking Glass and approve

#### **CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS**

Mayor Eveleth thanked Dan Jozwiak for over 20 years of service on the ZBA.

Tom Manke, Owosso Township resident, said the Historical Properties Director must not care about the City since he is from out of town. He also took Council to task for not answering his question about replacing water mains, saying they must care either.

Lon Zimmerman, 590 Hollywood Drive, indicated he had contacted the proper people at the City to see about dropping off his sister's leaves at the drop-off site but was told he would not be allowed to do so. He asked what proof was required to allow him to drop the leaves off. Mayor Eveleth noted that he understands there are restrictions as to who is allowed to drop off leaves at the dump site but he wondered what could be done in a situation like Mr. Zimmerman's. Utilities Director Chinavare indicated there was already a plan in place for such instances and he would talk with Mr. Zimmerman tomorrow. Councilmember Fox jumped in the conversation and said lots of elderly residents have someone rake their yard and drop off the leaves for them. He said there must be a way to allow people from outside of town to drop off leaves from a City property if they have the permission of the property owner.

#### SPECIAL PRESENTATION

#### **Skate Park Donations**

Three different groups were on-hand to present the City with donations for the construction of a new skate park.

Central School Principal Bridgit Spielman presented a check for \$256.00 in "pickle proceeds" on behalf of two students that held a pickle sale to benefit the skate park.

Three 5<sup>th</sup> graders from Bryant School presented a check for \$852.47 gathered through various student led fund raising events for the park.

Representatives from Masonic Lodge #81 presented the City with a donation of \$10,000.00 for the park saying they were pleased to be able to help.

Parks & Recreation Commission Chairman Mike Espich and Commissioner Randy Woodworth thanked everyone for their very generous donations and announced that a total of \$105,000.00 had been raised for the park.

#### **CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS**

Parks & Recreation Chairman Espich announced the annual parks clean-up event to be held May 12<sup>th</sup>.

Shannon Howansky of Century 21 Looking Glass, updated the Council on the changes she has instituted to the marketing plan for the Osburn Lakes properties since she took over the account a few weeks ago. She is a realtor and currently works with CVE Homes on new construction sales and development. She distributed folders containing new marketing information and proposals from CVE Homes for the construction of five new spec houses.

Kori Shook of Kori Shook & Associates, said she was present to provide Council with clarity as to what transpired after she left Century 21 in early March. She opened her own brokerage on March 6<sup>th</sup> and Century 21 signed a document releasing all of her listings to her at that time. A short time later she was informed by the City that Century 21 was trying to go back on their agreement with her and claw back the contract for the Osburn Lakes properties. She said her split from Century 21 had originally been amicable but she felt their current conduct violated the code of ethics.

Mayor Eveleth invited everyone to stop by the Farmers' Market this Saturday when it opens for the season at 9:00am.

Councilmember Fox asked for stepped up enforcement of the speed limit on East Oliver Street saying motorcycles have really taken to speeding down the new stretch of street. Mayor Pro-Tem Osika inquired whether putting up speed limit signs would help. It was noted that the signs were replaced when the street was repaved last year. Staff further noted that construction on the remaining portion of East Oliver Street will start soon which should slow traffic down and enforcement would be stepped up in the area.

#### **ITEM OF BUSINESS**

#### **Contract Termination – Real Estate Broker Services**

City Manager Nathan R. Henne indicated he had spoken with both real estate companies but they were unable to come to a consensus effectively leaving the City to choose between the two firms. He suggested terminating the existing contract and rebidding it, following a process similar to that used when the contract was originally bid. There was discussion among Councilmembers regarding the City's general distaste in taking on the developer role, whether the original developer had been properly vetted, if there are changes to the bylaws and master deed that could be made to entice people to the development, the effect of changing the rules on current residents, and installing signage marking the wetlands in the subdivision.

Finance Director Ruddy gave a PowerPoint presentation detailing the General Fund budget, how the budget is developed, sources of revenue, and a comparison with last year's expenditures. She indicated that the budget for the coming year had increased by 1.2% and \$156,000 in fund balance was proposed for use in balancing the budget (though this entire amount may not be required depending on experience). It is anticipated a second bond financing for road improvements in the coming year. She also noted that the City would be levying the maximum tax for SATA going forward. Any funding collected that is not requested by SATA in a particular year will be held in a fund for future use for SATA.

Finance Director Ruddy went on to discuss the debt costs predicted for 2018-19 estimated at approximately \$502,000. She noted that \$4.9 million of the \$10 million street bond has been spent to date. There was discussion regarding whether the City was able to secure a higher bond rating, using a specialized bond advisor with the letting of future bonds to help us get better rates.

Next the new Capital Improvement Fund was detailed. Ms. Ruddy indicated that the establishment of this fund is considered a best practice and its purpose is to show you the large purchases made each year and to help plan for the future.

At the conclusion of Finance Director Ruddy's presentation Mayor Eveleth asked if Council had any questions. Discussion followed regarding: how the Historical Commission the budget is developed and funded, what costs the City is responsible for in relation to the Shiawassee District Library, and future plans for professional development.

#### **CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS**

Gary Burk, former Utilities Director and current representative to the Mid-County Waste Water Treatment Plant Review Board, reported that the Board was considering increasing the plant operation/maintenance charge in response to overall cost increases and increasing the replacement charge to cover the rising cost of replacing old infrastructure. He said fund balance at the plant had been depleted by capital outlay projects and an increase would be necessary to prevent the fund from being drawn below a critical level. He went on to say that the plant, in its current form, was approaching 40 years old and will need a major update in the coming years to be able to continue to provide treatment services to the next generation. It is anticipated that the level of the update will be in the millions of dollars and will require some debt financing. Lastly, he noted that the plant still has a wet weather capacity issue and work needs to be done to reduce the amount of infiltrations into the system.

Councilmember Fox said he would like to see the agreement governing the operation of the plant reexamined to ensure the City isn't paying more than its fair share.

Mid-County Waste Water Treatment Plant Review Board member Gary Burk indicated he would like to see the grant funding for the replacement of lead and galvanized service lines stretched by replacing the eligible service lines of those homes affected by this year's street program.

Code of Ordinances.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Planning Commission hereby recommends setting a public hearing on Monday, May 7, 2018 to amend Section 26-19(1)a, Sign setbacks, of the *Owosso Code of Ordinances*.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

A public workshop was held by the Owosso Planning Commission on Monday, March 26, 2018 at its regularly scheduled meeting to receive citizen comment regarding the proposal to amend subsection (1)a, Sign setbacks, of Section 26-19, General standards for permitted signs, of the Code of the city of Owosso. The proposed ordinance amendment will reduce the setback requirement of ten (10) feet from any public right-of-way to five (5) feet. The previous sign ordinance, repealed and replaced in its entirety in June of 2017, had a setback requirement of five (5) feet from any public right-of-way. The current ordinance inadvertently set that requirement at ten (10) feet. The proposed amendment will help prevent future hardships on businesses wishing to replace their current signage and will work to keep the established distance of their current signage in compliance.

# TO AMEND SECTION 26-19(1)a OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF OWOSSO TO REDUCE SIGN SETBACKS

WHEREAS, subsection *1a. Sign setbacks*, of Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, outlines specific regulations regarding signage and setback requirements; and

WHEREAS, the setback requirements pertaining to public right-of-ways require modification to correct an error made when the ordinance was repealed and replaced in May 2017; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission held a public workshop at their March 26, 2018 regularly scheduled meeting regarding the proposed amendment to Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, subsection *1a. Sign setbacks* in which no citizen comments were voiced or received; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission recommends amending Section 26-19 (1)a to correct the error.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. That subsection *a. Sign setbacks* of Section 26-19(1). <u>General standards</u> for permitted signs of the Owosso City Code be amended to read:

#### Sec. 26-19. - General standards for permitted signs.

Signs which are permitted as accessory uses serving a commercial or informational purpose may be permitted subject to the requirements of this article; provided, that no such sign shall be erected or altered until approved by the building official/zoning administrator and until a sign permit has been issued pursuant to chapter 26 of the City of Owosso Code of Ordinances.

- (1) Sign setbacks.
  - a. All signs, unless otherwise provided for, shall be set back a minimum of five (5) feet from any public or private street right-of-way line or access drive in all districts. This distance shall be measured from the nearest edge of the sign, measured at a vertical line perpendicular to the ground to the right-of-way.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. The various sections and provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be severable, and should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any section or provision of this Ordinance other than the section or provision so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective May 27, 2018.

SECTION 5. AVAILABILITY. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerk's office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

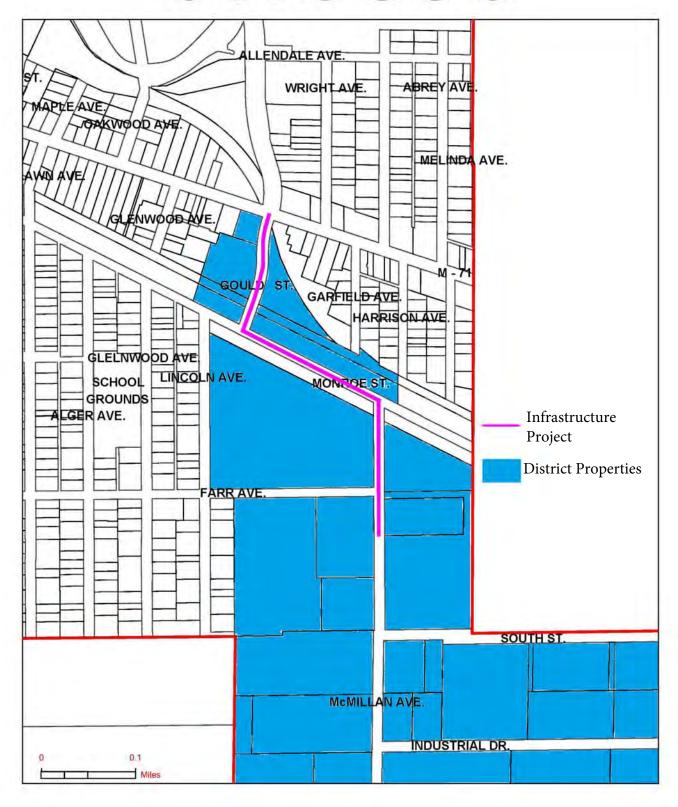

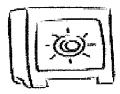

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

At the April 30, 2018 Council Meeting, Councilman Fox asked whether the City, as the "Developer", could unilaterally amend the Bylaw of Osburn Lakes if the existing Bylaws are deemed to be too restrictive and detrimental to the marketability of the remaining vacant lots. For example, Councilman Fox mentioned the requirement of "Eighteen months to build".

Upon my review of the said question, I found a Memorandum drafted by former City Attorney, William C. Brown, which I believe to be on point and is an opinion I that endorse. This memorandum was provided to the City Council on or about July 13, 2015 and is attached hereto.

Further, the Osburn Lake Bylaws and Michigan Law provides a considerable amount of leeway in regard to a "Developer" amending a master deed, bylaws, restrictions and the like, provided that any change does not **materially effect** the current members of the condominium. Therefore, if it is the desire of this Council to amend the Bylaws of Osburn Lake, I kindly request that the Council determine the specific items of concern, so that legal counsel may review whether a proposed amendment would materially effect the current members of the condominium.

At the July 6, 2015 Council Meeting, Councilman Teich asked whether the requirement to repurchase lots upon which construction has not commenced within 18 months could be amended.

The buyback clause in question is found on page 25 of the bylaws of Osburn Lakes Residential Site Condominium. This clause gives the city the right to repurchase the unit if construction has not commenced within eighteen (18) months from the date the first owner other than the developer. The option will run until construction has commenced. However, this clause does not require that city repurchase the lot, instead the clause gives the city the right to repurchase after the eighteen months and up until construction starts.

Both the Master Deed and the Bylaws may be amended. The ways in which an amendment can be made are found on page 16 of the Master Deed under Article XII. The deed and bylaws can be amended by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the votes of the co-owners and two-thirds (2/3) of the first mortgagees. A co-owner will have one vote for each unit owned and a mortgagee will have one vote for each first mortgage held. These votes may be achieved by written consents or by votes at any regular meeting or any special meeting called for such purpose, or a combination of votes and consents. Or the documents can be amended by the developer without the consent of the co-owners or mortgagees in order to terminate or eliminate reference to any right which Developer has reserved to itself.

In this instance the right to repurchase is a right held only by the Developer. Therefore, the developer can terminate or eliminate, without consent of co-owners or mortgagees, the right to repurchase a unit in which construction has not commenced within eighteen (18) months from the date the first owner other than the developer acquires legal or equitable to such unit.
