Ordinance Amendment - Chapter 26, Signs

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment on the proposal to amend Chapter 26, <u>Signs</u>, Article IV, *General Provisions*, Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, subsection 1a, *Sign setbacks*, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso to correct an error related to the permitted setback for signs.

There were no citizen comments received prior to, or during the meeting.

Whereas, the Council, after due and legal notice, has met and there being no one to be heard, motion by Councilmember Bailey that the following ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 792

TO AMEND SECTION 26-19(1)a OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF OWOSSO TO REDUCE SIGN SETBACKS

WHEREAS, subsection *1a. Sign setbacks*, of Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, outlines specific regulations regarding signage and setback requirements; and

WHEREAS, the setback requirements pertaining to public right-of-ways require modification to correct an error made when the ordinance was repealed and replaced in May 2017; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission held a public workshop at their March 26, 2018 regularly scheduled meeting regarding the proposed amendment to Section 26-19, <u>General standards for permitted signs</u>, subsection *1a. Sign setbacks* in which no citizen comments were voiced or received; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission recommends amending Section 26-19 (1)a to correct the error.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. That subsection *a. Sign setbacks* of Section 26-19(1). <u>General standards</u> for permitted signs of the Owosso City Code be amended to read:

Sec. 26-19. - General standards for permitted signs.

Signs which are permitted as accessory uses serving a commercial or informational purpose may be permitted subject to the requirements of this article; provided, that no such sign shall be erected or altered until approved by the building official/zoning administrator and until a sign permit has been issued pursuant to chapter 26 of the City of Owosso Code of Ordinances.

- (1) Sign setbacks.
 - a. All signs, unless otherwise provided for, shall be set back a minimum of five (5) feet from any public or private street right-of-way line or access drive in all districts. This distance shall be measured from the nearest edge of the sign, measured at a vertical line perpendicular to the ground to the right-of-way.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. The various sections and provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be severable, and should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any section or provision of this Ordinance other than the section or provision so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

- <u>Outstanding Achievements</u>. The city of Owosso developed and completed Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) Asset Management Plans for:
 - Wastewater Treatment
 - Water Treatment & Filtration
 - Wastewater Collection System & Geodatabase
 - Water Distribution System & Geodatabase
 - Water Reliability Study
- <u>Demonstrated Compliance</u>. The Owosso Water Filtration Facility is consistently below regulatory maximum allowable limits for drinking water contaminants of concern.
- Water Sampling Excellence. The city of Owosso consistently achieved 100% on all proficiency tests issued by the State of Michigan, for laboratory sampling processes at both the Wastewater Treatment Facility and the Water Filtration Facility.

In addition, the Water Filtration Facility recently received a Full Laboratory Certification in microbiology from MDEQ for years 2018 thru 2020. This is as result of the 100% proficiency sampling accomplished by operators Lisa Nation and Weston Dodge, as well as the training, guidance, and expertise provided by Superintendent Dave Haut.

- NPDES Permit for Wastewater Treatment, and Public Water System Permit for Drinking Water. Both facilities are authorized by the State of Michigan to operate in accordance with permits as issued.

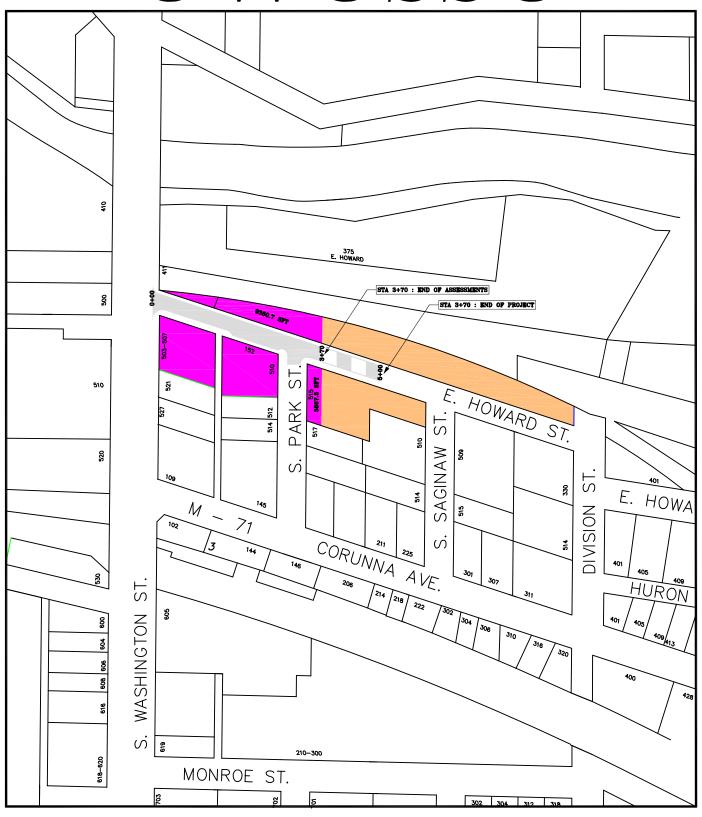

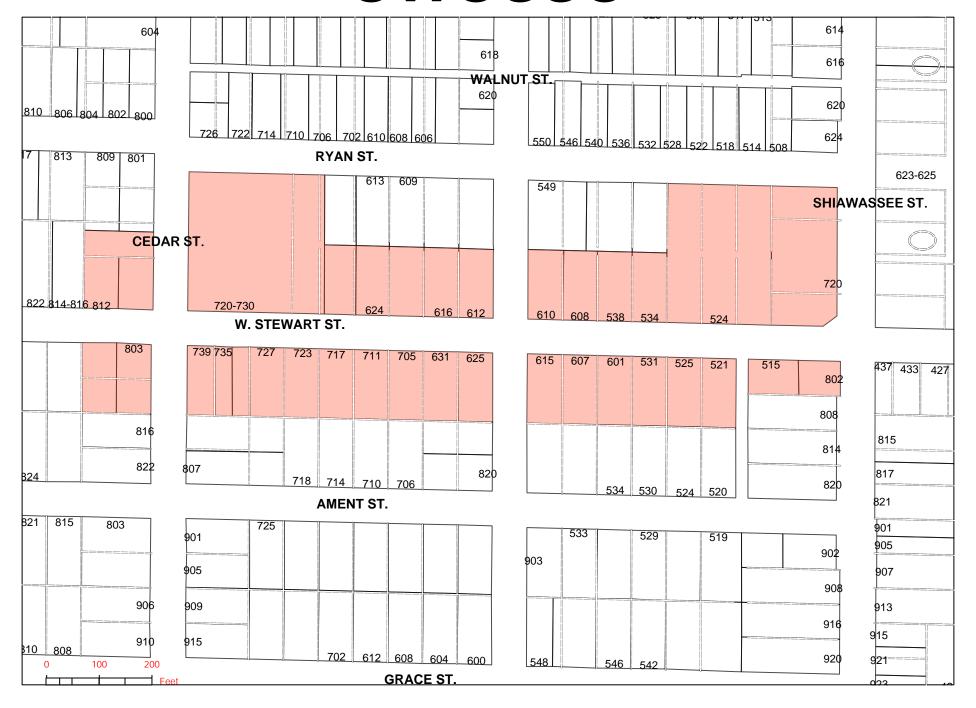

RECOMMENDATION

Approval of Change Order No. 5 to the contract with Spicer Group, Inc. for additional professional engineering services for the Oliver Street Reconstruction Project in the amount of \$126,258.00.

BACKGROUND

On May 2, 2016, City Council awarded a contract to Spicer Group, Inc. for professional engineering services for the Oliver Street Reconstruction Project. This project was approved for grant funding by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) under the category Federal Aid Small Urban. Due to the nature of grant funds as well as the oversite provided by MDOT, this project required much greater administrative control than other similar construction projects. The city of Owosso contracted with and agreed to manage this project in accordance with MDOT rules and procedures. In addition, the contractor was selected by and controlled by MDOT, while the engineering firm of Spicer Group was selected by and controlled by the city of Owosso.

Phase I construction contract was awarded in the amount of \$1,315,369.00. Additional costs to close this contract out will result in another estimated \$11,000.00 for an unplanned manhole replacement and additional subgrade pavement removal not identified during soil borings. Expected construction costs will be \$1,326,369.00. Phase I engineering design, inspection, and construction administration costs occurred as follows:

•	Initial Project Award	\$184,850.00	
•	Change Order No. 1	\$74,775.00	Necessary to secure a second grant amount of \$375.000.00 by moving project into two fiscal years.
•	Change Order No. 2	\$2,200.00	Water main extension for Emerson Elementary School.
•	Change Order No. 3	\$12,706.00	Design modification (bike lanes, driveways, road crown point).
•	Change Order No. 4	\$95,000.00	Phase I completion for MDOT admin and inspection, and
		\$369,531.00	completion of Phase I & II design services. This is nearly
			28% of the construction costs.

Phase II construction contract was awarded in the amount of \$1,101,263.00. Spicer requested additional services for Phase II in the amount of \$160,463.00 for construction inspection and administration. I had initially negotiated this down to \$100,000.00. However, this left little or no room for contingencies. Therefore, I agreed to \$126,258.00 with the understanding that this is the final change order, and represents 11.5% of the construction contract award.

To put these numbers into perspective, Phase I and II construction costs are currently at \$2,427,632.00 Phase I & II

engineering costs now total \$495,729.00, and reflect 20.4% of projected construction costs. Due to the dollar amount of the project hitting well into the seven digit range, it is not unusual for engineering costs to be 17 - 19%. However, if Phase I & II could have been completed in one fiscal year, it is felt the total engineering costs would have been closer to 18%, but the city would not have received the second \$375,000.00 grant.

Major factors impacting engineering costs for this project are:

- Spicer Group under estimating hours (minimal safety factor) to manage construction contractor and complete the administrative burden of MDOT testing and documentation requirements.
- Construction contractor changed work schedule, which resulted in more oversite man-hours by Spicer Group for complying with MDOT rules.
- Resident complaints and inquiries resulted in additional Spicer Group man-hours to address and resolve.
- Delays in isolating water mains by city staff due to poor valve operating conditions.
- Contractor difficulty in performing some water main installation applications.

FISCAL IMPACTS

Funds for this change order in the amount of \$126,258.00 are available in Major Street Construction Account No. 202-451-818.000, water fund, and other funds as appropriated.

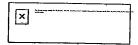

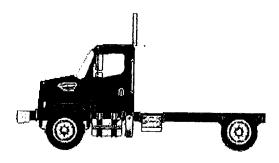

SUBJECT: Selection of an audit firm

Last year we extended our contract with Rehmann Robson to audit our financial statements. However, they were not contacted to submit a RFP for the upcoming three audit years. It should be noted that the exclusion of their firm from the RFP process should not be a reflection on the level of their performance. The city was more than satisfied with their work. However, because it is important to ensure that fresh eyes are periodically looking at the financial records, the city has decided to select from four new firms.

In late March an RFP was sent to four audit firms; AHP, Gabridge & Co., Yeo & Yeo, and Plante Moran. The proposals were due back to the city by March 27th; all four of the audit firms met this deadline. Attached is a summary of price and estimated hours from each of the four audit firms.

Since I have only worked with Plante Moran in the past, I called other municipalities to get some additional information on each of the other firms. One of the questions that I asked was to rate the firm on a scale from 1 to 5 with 5 being the highest score. I have noted those scores below.

AHP (Andrews Hooper Pavlik): The original audit cost was \$47,275 but they are discounting the price by \$22,275; with a final cost for the first year of \$25,000. A large discount can often mean that they must utilize less experienced staff for most of the audit engagement. In my experience, the less experienced staff utilized the greater amount of time that the city staff must spend on the audit (training the auditor). I was able to talk to three municipalities whom all confirmed the above by saying AHP spent excessive time on site. Another comment was that AHP often charged supplemental fees that the municipality had thought were included in the price. The overall rating given by the three municipalities was 3.33.

Gabridge & Co: The original audit cost was \$34,960 but they are discounting the price by \$7,000; with a final cost for the first year of \$27,960. The discount was given because they have less audit

engagements at that time of the year. I was able to talk to two municipalities that have used Gabridge & Co., and all of their comments were positive. Both said that Gabridge & Co only spent one to two weeks on site and they were never charged additional fees. The overall rating given by the two municipalities was 4.5.

Yeo & Yeo: Yeo and Yeo audit cost for the first year was \$32,500. I was able to talk to two municipalities about their experience with Yeo & Yeo. All comments were positive. Both said Yeo & Yeo was able to spend under a week on site, they were knowledgeable about new GASB's, and even offered free client training. The overall rating given by the two municipalities was 4.00.

Plante Moran: Plante Moran had the highest cost at \$37,500 for the first year. However, I have worked with their firm for many years and would highly recommend them. Although their cost is the highest, they bring a high level of expertise in the government arena and are able to help government units make sense of the ever changing audit standards. Plante Moran also provides free staff training throughout the year. Since I have worked with Plante Moran in the past and am recommending a different firm because of client satisfaction and price, I did not contact any other municipalities.

RECOMMENDATION

Gabridge & Co. received positive comments from the clients I spoke with, they have the second lowest price, and they had the highest rating; my recommendation is to hire Gabridge & Co. as the city's audit firm for the next three audit years.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Select an audit firm for a three year period to contract with the City of Owosso to audit its financial statements.

RESOLUTION NO.

AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE SHIAWASSEE COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES MUTUAL AID 2018 AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, has the power, privilege and authority to maintain and operate a police department providing police protection; and

WHEREAS, two or more governmental entities may, pursuant to the provisions of 1967 PA 236, being MCL 123.811, enter into an Agreement to provide mutual aid police assistance and services to one another; and

WHEREAS, certain situations may exist in the nature of public nuisances, public disturbances, or in cooperative law enforcement activities where mutual aid may be necessary or appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso desires to update the interlocal agreement between Shiawassee County police departments, pursuant to the Act, to further improve Police Services; and

WHEREAS, each governmental entity, by their respective governing bodies, is willing to provide mutual police aid and assistance to the others, subject to the powers, duties and responsibilities and legal liabilities established by this agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

FIRST: The City of Owosso finds it is the best interest of its citizens from a safety and fiscal

standpoint to approve participation in the Shiawassee County Law Enforcement Agencies

Mutual Aid 2018 Agreement.

SECOND: The Public Safety Director is instructed and authorized to sign the document substantially

in the form attached as the Shiawassee County Law Enforcement Agencies Mutual Aid

2018 Agreement.

SHIAWASSEE COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES MUTUAL AID 2018 AGREEMENT

For the general purpose of rendering reciprocal law enforcement assistance, pursuant to the Mutual Police Assistance Agreements Act, 1967 PA 236, MCL 123.811 et seq., and to maintain and enhance the health, welfare and safety of the respective communities, Shiawassee County, City of Corunna, City of Durand, City of Laingsburg, Village of Lennon, Village of Morrice, Village of New Lothrop, City of Owosso, City of Perry, Village of Vernon (the "Jurisdictions" or "Participating Jurisdictions") hereby enter into a Mutual Aid Reciprocal Law Enforcement Agreement (the "Agreement"), upon the following terms and conditions:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, two or more governmental entities may, pursuant to the provisions of 1967 PA 236, being MCL 123.811, enter an Agreement to provide mutual police assistance and services to one another; and

WHEREAS, certain situations may exist like public nuisances, public disturbances, or in cooperative law enforcement activities where mutual aid may be necessary or appropriate; and

WHEREAS, each governmental entity, by their respective governing bodies, is willing to provide mutual police aid and assistance to the others, subject to the powers, duties, responsibilities and legal liabilities established by this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, it is agreed as follows:

1. Definitions.

- A. "Governmental Unit" or "Governmental Units" shall individually and collectively mean Shiawassee County and the cities, villages, who are parties to this Agreement.
- B. "Personnel" shall mean the police and/or sheriff deputies of Shiawassee County, and the peace officers of cities, villages, who are parties to this Agreement.
- C. "Commanding Officer" shall mean the highest ranking police officer in the governmental unit having an emergency who is on duty and the designee, who has responsibility for directing his/her department at the time of an emergency.
- D. "Emergency" shall mean a combination of circumstances requiring immediate action that requires more personnel or equipment than that available to the requesting governmental unit at the time of the emergency.

- E. "Requesting Governmental Unit" shall mean the governmental unit in which an emergency exists and who requests aid pursuant to this Agreement.
- F. "Responding Governmental Unit" shall mean the governmental unit that sends personnel and/or equipment to a requesting governmental unit pursuant to this Agreement.
- G. "Standard Request for Assistance" shall mean an incident where a citizen request has been received relating to an incident within a governmental unit and that particular unit does not have a personnel available at that time.
- H. "911 Call Center" shall mean the Shiawassee County 911 Central Dispatch Center.
- **2. Determination and Declaration of an Emergency.** The commanding officer shall be responsible for determining and declaring that an emergency exists in his/her governmental unit.
- **3.** Emergency Request for Assistance. Upon determining and declaring that an emergency exists, the commanding officer of the requesting governmental unit will make a request for aid to the commanding officer of the responding governmental unit.
- **4. Response to Emergency Request.** The commanding officer of the responding governmental unit will make available to the commanding officer of the requesting governmental unit such personnel and equipment to meet the needs of the emergency.
- **5. Direction at Scene of Emergency.** The incident commander of the requesting governmental unit will be the person in charge at the emergency scene. All personnel and equipment of a responding governmental unit will be under the control and direction of the incident commander of the requesting governmental unit upon arriving at the scene of the emergency.
- **6. Withdrawal of Personnel and Equipment.** The personnel and equipment of a responding governmental unit may be withdrawn anytime in the discretion of the commanding officer of a responding governmental unit. The responding governmental unit will not have any obligation to keep its personnel or equipment in the requesting governmental unit for a longer time than is deemed necessary by the commanding officer of the responding governmental unit.

7. Independent Contractor.

Each governmental unit shall be considered an independent contractor and not an agent or employee of the other. Nor shall an agent or employee of a governmental unit be considered an agent or employee of the other governmental unit. Each governmental unit shall remain responsible for any claims arising out of their own acts or omissions during the performance of this Agreement, as provided by law.

This Agreement is not intended to increase any governmental units liability for or immunity from, tort claims.

8. Insurance.

Each governmental unit shall maintain during the term of the Agreement appropriate liability insurance and Workers Compensation Insurance, including Employers' Liability Coverage in accordance with all applicable statutes of the State of Michigan.

- **9. Employee Benefits.** Each governmental unit in this Agreement will continue to provide the same salaries, workers' compensation, retirement and other fringe benefits to its employees responding to a mutual aid request as those employees would receive while on duty in their own governmental unit.
- **10. Costs of Equipment and Supplies.** Costs of equipment and supplies used while giving assistance will be borne by the governmental unit owning the equipment and supplies.
- 11. Federal or State Reimbursement for Emergency Funds. The requesting governmental unit in an emergency, when applying for federal or state funds for reimbursement of the cost of the emergency operations, shall apply for such funds for responding governmental units. Each governmental unit will maintain appropriate records to support such applications.
- 12. Nondiscrimination. The governmental units who are parties to this agreement, as required by law, will not discriminate against an employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment, or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, disability, height, weight, marital status, political affiliations or beliefs. Breach of this section will be regarded as a material breach of this agreement.
- **13. Amendments.** Modifications, amendments or waivers of any provision of this agreement may be made only by the written mutual consent of the parties hereto.
- **14. Completeness of the Agreement.** This agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the governmental units who are parties hereto, and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement or any part thereof shall have any validity or bind either of the parties hereto.
- **15. Invalid Provisions.** If any provision of this agreement is held to be invalid, it shall be considered deleted and the remainder of this agreement will not be affected. Where the deletion of the invalid provision would result in the illegality and/or unenforceability of this agreement, this agreement shall be considered to have terminated as of the date in which the provision was declared invalid.

- **16. Withdrawal from Agreement.** A community may withdraw from its participation in this Agreement for any reason anytime upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other communities.
- 17. Agreement Term. The term of this Agreement will be four (4) years from the date of the full execution of this Agreement by the \ participating jurisdictions. Thereafter, this Agreement will continue in effect for successive (4) four year periods unless terminated or amended in writing. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and there are no valid promises, conditions or understandings that are not contained herein. This Agreement may not be amended or modified unless in writing and signed by all participating jurisdictions.
- **18.** Certification of Authority to Sign the Agreement. The persons signing this agreement on behalf of the governmental units who are parties hereto certify by their signatures that they are duly authorized to sign this agreement on behalf of said parties and that this agreement has been authorized by said parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the authorized representatives of the parties hereto have fully signed this Agreement on the day and year first above written. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall constitute a duplicate original, but all counterparts together shall constitute a single agreement.

Section 6: Millage Levy

The City Council shall cause to be levied and collected the general property tax on all real and personal property within the city upon the current tax roll an amount equal to 15.9770 mills per \$1,000 of taxable value consisting of 13.0070 mills for operating, 1.0000 mill to operate a solid waste recycling program and 1.9700 mills for debt

Section 7: Adoption of Budget by Reference

The general fund budget of the City of Owosso is hereby adopted by reference, with revenues and activity expenditures as indicated in Sections 4 and 5 of this act.

Section 8: Appropriation not a Mandate to Spend

Appropriations will be deemed maximum authorizations to incur expenditures. The fiscal officer shall exercise supervision and control to ensure that expenditures are within appropriations, and shall not issue any city order for expenditures that exceed appropriations.

Section 9: Periodic Fiscal Reports

The fiscal officer shall provide the City Council monthly reports of fiscal year to date revenues and expenditures compared to the budgeted amounts.

Section 10: Limit on Obligations and Payments

No obligation shall be incurred against, and no payment shall be made from any appropriation account unless there is a sufficient unencumbered balance in the appropriation and sufficient funds are or will be available to meet the obligation.

Section 11: Budget Monitoring

Whenever it appears to the fiscal officer or the city Council that the actual and probable revenues in any fund will be less than the estimated revenues upon which appropriations from such fund were based, and when it appears that expenditures shall exceed an appropriation, the fiscal officer shall present to the city Council recommendations to prevent expenditures from exceeding available revenues or appropriations for the current fiscal year. Such recommendations shall include proposals for reducing appropriations, increasing revenues, or both.

Consumers may attach additional lines outside the Easement Area, running laterally from a line within the Easement Area to the South edge(s) of Owner's Land, in which event the Easement Area shall include a 12-foot-wide strip of land, being 6 feet on each side of each such lateral line constructed on Owner's Land.

<u>Additional Work Space</u>: In addition to the Easement rights granted herein, Owner further grants to Consumers, during initial construction and installation only, the right to temporarily use such additional work space reasonably required to construct said lines. Said temporary work space shall abut the Easement Area, on either side, as required by construction.

<u>Access</u>: Consumers shall have the right to unimpaired access to said line or lines, and the right of ingress and egress on, over, and through Owner's Land for any and all purposes necessary, convenient, or incidental to the exercise by Consumers of the rights granted hereunder.

<u>Trees and Other Vegetation</u>: Owner shall not plant any trees within the Easement Area. installation or any other type of structure over, under, or on said Easement Area, whether temporary or permanent, natural or man-made, without a prior written agreement executed by Consumers' Real Estate Department expressly allowing the aforementioned.

<u>Ground Elevation</u>: Owner shall not materially alter the ground elevation within the Easement Area without a prior written agreement executed by Consumers Real Estate Department allowing said alteration.

<u>Exercise of Easement</u>: Consumers' nonuse or limited use of this Easement shall not preclude Consumers' later use of this Easement to its full extent.

Ownership: Owner covenants with Consumers that they are the lawful fee simple owner of the aforesaid lands, and that they have the right and authority to make this grant, and that they will forever warrant and defend the title thereto against all claims whatsoever.

<u>Successors</u>: This easement shall bind and benefit Owner's and Consumers' respective heirs, successors, lessees, licensees, and assigns.

<u>Counterparts</u>: This easement may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. It is not necessary that all parties execute any single counterpart if each party executes at least one counterpart.

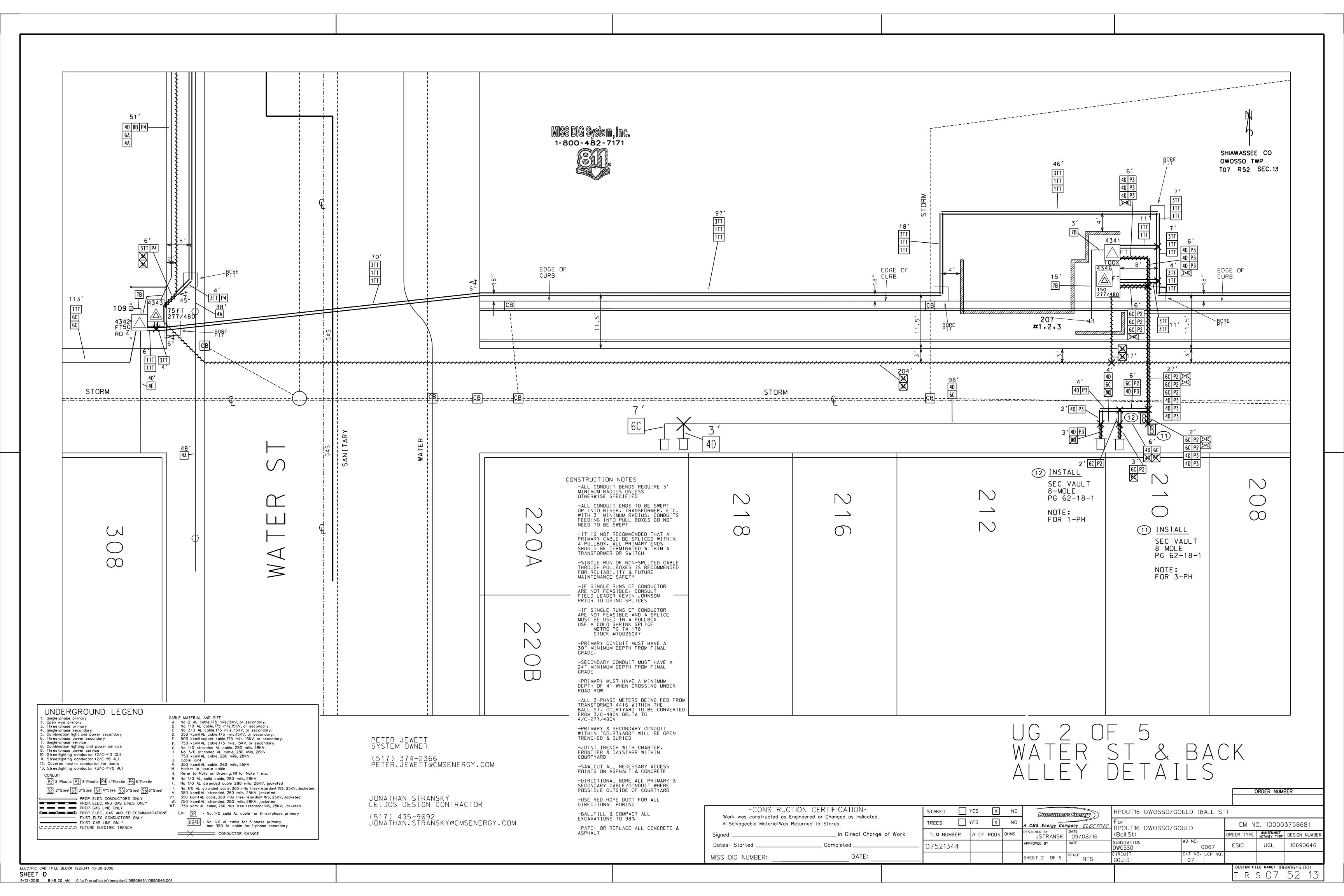

SUBJECT: Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) Agreement

BACKGROUND:

The Owosso Fire Department maintains a countywide mutual aid agreement for all fire departments in Shiawassee County. We work closely with our neighboring communities but there are instances in which resources may be needed on a regional or national basis. MABAS is an inter-local agreement that allows for municipal fire departments to join together to address disasters or significant threats to public safety and health. MABAS allows for the creation of a box alarm system that formalizes the capabilities and expectations of each member community participant.

MABAS has currently been adopted or is in the process of being adopted in all counties that border Shiawassee County. In March 2018, all Fire Departments from Shiawassee County agreed to implement MABAS in their respective communities. Joining MABAS provides the same mutual aid benefit we already receive and enhances our benefits on a regional level. There are no fees, and reimbursement methods are provided for in the agreement for special situations.

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend the adoption of a resolution to have the City of Owosso/Owosso Fire Department join MI-MABAS Region 1.

AUTHORIZING THE PARTICIPATION IN THE MICHIGAN MUTUAL AID BOX ALARM SYSTEM (MABAS)

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, has the power, privilege and authority to maintain and operate a fire department providing fire protection, fire suppression, emergency medical services, technical rescue, hazardous incident response, and other emergency response services ("Fire Services"); and

WHEREAS, Fire Services can further be improved by cooperation between political subdivisions during times of public emergency, conflagration or disaster ("Incidents"); and

WHEREAS, the Michigan Constitution of 1963, Article 7, § 28, and the Urban Cooperation Act of 1967, Act No. 7 of the Public Acts of 1967, Ex. Sess., being MCL 124.501 et seq. (the "Act"), permit a political subdivision to exercise jointly with any other political subdivision any power, privilege or authority which such political subdivisions share in common and which each might exercise separately; and

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso desires to enter into an interlocal agreement, pursuant to the Act, to further improve Fire Services; and

WHEREAS, the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS), is a mechanism that may be used for deploying personnel and equipment in a multi-jurisdictional or multi-agency emergency mutual aid response; and

WHEREAS, as a result of entering into said interlocal agreement the Parties will create the Shiawassee County MABAS Division; and

WHEREAS, The City of Owosso has the authority to execute this Agreement pursuant to resolution of its governing body; and

WHEREAS, The City of Owosso desires to commit personnel and equipment to another Party if deemed reasonable upon the request of another Party per the terms of the agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan that:

This Agreement is entered into between the participating units of local government "Parties" that execute this Agreement and adopt its terms and conditions as provided by law.

This Agreement supersedes any and all prior Agreements and amendments to the Michigan Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Association Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Michigan, 1963, Article VII, Section 28, authorizes units of local government to contract as provided by law; and,

WHEREAS, the Urban Cooperation Act, of 1967, 1967 PA 7, MCL 124.501, et seq., provides that any political subdivision of Michigan or of another state may enter into interlocal agreements for joint exercise of power, privilege, or authority that agencies share in common and might each exercise separately; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties have determined that it is in their best interests to enter into this Agreement to secure to each the benefits of mutual aid in fire protection, suppression, rescue and emergency medical assistance, hazardous materials control, technical rescue and/or other emergency support for an Emergency, Disaster, or other Serious Threat to Public Health and Safety; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties have determined that it is in their best interests to form an association to provide for communications procedures, training, and other functions to further the provision of said protection of life and property during an Emergency,

Disaster, or other Serious Threat to Public Health and Safety; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution and people of the State of Michigan have long recognized the value of cooperation by and among the state and its political subdivisions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

SECTION ONE

Purpose

It is recognized and acknowledged that in certain situations, such as natural disasters and man-made catastrophes, no political subdivision possesses all the necessary resources to cope with every possible Emergency, Disaster or Serious Threat to Public Safety, and an effective, efficient response can be best achieved by leveraging collective resources from other political subdivisions. Further, it is acknowledged that coordination of mutual aid through the Michigan Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Association (MI-MABAS) is most effective for best practices and efficient provision of mutual aid.

SECTION TWO

Definitions

The Parties agree that the following words and expressions, as used in this Agreement, whenever initially capitalized, whether used in the singular or plural, possessive or non-possessive, either within or without quotation marks, shall be defined and interpreted as follows:

- A. "Agreement" means the MI-MABAS Agreement.
- B. "Michigan Mutual Aid Box Alarm System" ("MABAS") means a definite and prearranged plan whereby response and assistance is provided to a Requesting Party by an Assisting Party in accordance with the system established and maintained by MI-MABAS Members;

- C. "Party" means a political subdivision which has entered into this Agreement as a signatory;
- D. "Requesting Party" means any Party requesting assistance under this agreement;
- E. "Assisting Party" means any Party furnishing equipment, personnel, and/or services to a Requesting Party under this agreement;
- F. "Emergency" means an occurrence or condition in a Party's jurisdiction which results in a situation of such magnitude and/or consequence that it cannot be adequately handled by the Requesting Party and such that a Requesting Party determines the necessity of requesting aid;
- G. "Disaster" means an occurrence or threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from a natural or human-made cause, including fire, flood, snowstorm, ice storm, tornado, windstorm, wave action, oil spill, water contamination, utility failure, hazardous peacetime radiological incident, major transportation accident,

hazardous materials incident, epidemic, air contamination, or similar occurrences resulting from terrorist activities, riots, or civil disorders;

- H. "Serious Threats to Public Health and Safety" means other threats or incidents such as those described as Disasters, of sufficient magnitude that the necessary public safety response threatens to overwhelm local resources and requires mutual aid or other assistance;
- I. "Division" means the geographically associated Parties which have been grouped for operational efficiency and representation of those Parties;
- J. "Training" means the regular scheduled practice of emergency procedures during non-emergency drills to implement the necessary joint operations of MI-MABAS;

- K. "Executive Board" means the governing body of MI-MABAS composed of Division representatives.
- L. "Effective Date" means the date on which the Agreement is first filed with the Department of State, the Office of the Great Seal, and each county where Parties are located.
- M. "Special Operations Teams" means MI-MABAS recognized teams of personnel with the requisite training and skill for Hazardous Materials Response, Technical Rescue Response (including Strike Teams and Michigan Task Force 1) and Incident Management Teams.

SECTION THREE

Establishment of the Association, the Divisions and Executive Board of MI-MABAS

A. Establishment of the Association

- The Parties intend and agree that MI-MABAS is established as separate legal entity and public body corporate pursuant to the Michigan Urban Cooperation Act of 1967, 1967 PA, MCL 124.505(c) and this Agreement.
- 2. Name of MI-MABAS. The formal name of the Association is "Michigan Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Association".
- 3. Federal Tax Status. The Parties intend that MI-MABAS and all Divisions shall be exempt from federal income tax under Section 115(1) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any future tax code
- 4. State and Local Tax Status. The parties intend that the MI-MABAS and all Divisions shall be exempt from all State and local taxation including, but not

- limited to, sales, use, income, single business, and property taxes under the applicable provisions of the laws of the State.
- 5. Title to MI-MABAS Property. All property is owned by MI-MABAS as a separate legal entity. MI-MABAS may hold any of its property in its own name or in the name of one (1) or more of the Parties or Divisions, as determined by the Parties.
- 6. Principal Office. The principal office of the Association ("Principal Office") shall be at such locations determined by the MI-MABAS Executive Board.

B. Establishment of the Executive Board.

An Executive Board shall be established to consider, adopt, and amend needed rules, procedures, by-laws and any other matters deemed necessary by the Parties. The Executive Board shall consist of a member elected from each Division of MI-MABAS who shall serve as the voting representative of said Division of MI-MABAS matters, and may appoint a designee from his or her Division to serve temporarily in his or her stead. Such designee shall have all rights and privileges attendant to a representative of the Division. A President and Vice President shall be elected from the representatives of the Parties and shall serve without compensation. The President and other officers shall coordinate the activities of the MI-MABAS Association.

SECTION FOUR

Duties of the Executive Board

The Executive Board shall meet regularly to conduct business and to consider and publish the rules, procedures, and bylaws of the MI-MABAS Association, which shall govern the Executive Board meetings and such other relevant matters as the Executive Board shall deem necessary.

SECTION FIVE

Rules and Procedures

Rules, procedures, and by laws of the MI-MABAS Association shall be established by the Member Units via the Executive Board as deemed necessary for the purpose of administrative functions, the exchange of information, and the common welfare of the MI-MABAS.

SECTION SIX

Authority and Action to Effect Mutual Aid

- A. The Parties hereby authorize and direct their respective Fire Chief or his or her designee to take necessary and proper action to render and/or request mutual aid from the other Parties in accordance with the policies and procedure established and maintained by the MI-MABAS Association.
- B. Upon a Fire Department's receipt of a request from another Party for Fire Services, the
 Fire Chief, the ranking officer on duty, or other officer as designated by the Fire Chief
 shall have the right to commit the requested Firefighters, other personnel, and Fire
 Apparatus to the assistance of the requesting Party. The aid rendered shall be to the extent
 of available personnel and equipment not required for adequate protection of the
 territorial limits of the Responding Party. The judgment of the Fire Chief, or his or her

- designee, of the Responding Party shall be final as to the personnel and equipment available to render aid.
- C. An authorized representative of the Party which has withheld or refused to provide requested assistance under this Agreement shall immediately notify the Requesting Party, and shall submit an explanation for the refusal.

SECTION SEVEN

Jurisdiction Over Personnel and Equipment

Personnel dispatched to aid a party pursuant to this Agreement shall at all times remain employees of the Assisting Party, and are entitled to receive benefits and/or compensation to which they are otherwise entitled to under the Michigan Workers' Disability Compensation Act of 1969, any pension law, or any act of Congress. Personnel dispatched intrastate to assist a party pursuant to this Agreement continue to enjoy all powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities as provided by Michigan Law. When Parties are dispatched pursuant to the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), the Parties shall adhere to all provisions of the EMAC. Personnel rendering aid shall report for direction and assignment at the scene of the emergency to the Incident Commander of the Requesting Party.

SECTION EIGHT

Compensation for Aid

Equipment, personnel, and/or services provided pursuant to this Agreement, absent a state or federal declaration of emergency or disaster, excluding resources for Special Operations Teams, shall be at no charge to the Requesting Party for the first eight hours. Any expenses recoverable from third parties shall be equitably distributed among Responding Parties.

Requests for a response from any MI-MABAS Special Operations Team may require full and

complete reimbursement to the responding Team for all expenses, including but not limited to, expenses for equipment, personnel, management and administration and all other services provided at an incident. The Executive Board shall adopt fee schedules that establish rates for Special Operations Team responses. Nothing herein shall operate to bar any recovery of funds from any state or federal agency under any existing statues. The Parties reserve the right to waive any charges to a Requesting Party.

SECTION NINE

Insurance

Each Party shall procure and maintain, at its sole and exclusive expense, insurance coverage, including comprehensive liability, personal injury, property damage, worker's compensation, and, if applicable, emergency medical service professional liability, with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 auto and \$1,000,000 combined single limit general liability and professional liability. The obligations of the Section may be satisfied by a Party's membership in a self-insurance pool, a self-insurance plan, or arrangement with an insurance provider approved by the state of jurisdiction. The Executive Board may require that copies or other evidence of compliance with the provisions of this Section be provided by the Parties to the Executive Board.

SECTION TEN

Liability

Each Party will be solely responsible for the acts of its own employees, agents, and subcontractors, the costs associated with those acts, and the defense of those acts. The Parties shall not be responsible for any liability or costs associated with those acts and the defense of those acts for Parties outside of their political jurisdictions. It is agreed that none of the Parties

shall be liable for failure to respond for any reason to any request for Fire Services or for leaving the scene of an Incident with proper notice after responding to a request for service.

SECTION ELEVEN

No Waiver of Governmental Immunity

All of the privileges and immunities from liability, and exemptions from laws, ordinances and rules, and all pensions, relief, disability, worker's compensation and other benefits which apply to the activity of Parties, officers, agency, or employees of any public agents or employees of any public agency when performing their respective functions within the territorial limits for their respective agencies, shall apply to the same degree and extent to the performance of such functions and duties of such Parties, officers, agents, or employees extraterritorially under the provision of this Agreement. No provision of the Agreement is intended, nor shall any provision of this Agreement be construed, as a waiver by any Party of any governmental immunity as provided by the Act or otherwise under law.

SECTION TWELVE

Term

- A. The existence of MI-MABAS commences on the Effective Date and continues until terminated in accordance with this Section.
- B. Any Party may withdraw, at any time, from this Agreement for any reason, or for no reason at all, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Association. The withdrawal of any Party shall not terminate or have any effect upon the provisions of this Agreement so long as the MI-MABAS remains composed of at least two (2) Parties. Parties withdrawing from MI-MABAS and subsequently requesting a mutual aid resource from a MI-MABAS member may be subject to reasonable fees for that resource according to the fee schedule established, and periodically reviewed and updated, by the Executive Board.
- C. This Agreement shall continue until terminated by the first to occur of the following:
 - (i) The Association consists of less than two (2) Parties; or,

(ii) A unanimous vote of termination by the total membership of the Executive Board.

SECTION THIRTEEN

Miscellaneous

- A. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between the Parties.

 The language of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning and not construed strictly for or against any party. The Parties have taken all actions and secured all approvals necessary to authorize and complete this Agreement.
- B. <u>Severability of Provisions</u>. If a Court of competent jurisdiction finds any provision of this Agreement invalid or unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement. The remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force.
- C. <u>Governing Law/Consent to Jurisdiction and Venue</u>. This Agreement is made and entered into in the State of Michigan and shall in all respects be interpreted, enforced, and governed under the laws of the State of Michigan.
- D. <u>Captions</u>. The captions, headings, and titles in this Agreement are intended for the convenience of the reader and not intended to have any substantive meaning and are not to be interpreted as part of this Agreement.
- E. <u>Terminology</u>. All terms and words used in this Agreement, regardless of the numbers or gender in which they are used, are deemed to include any other number and any other gender as the context may require.
- F. Recitals. The Recitals shall be considered an integral part of this Agreement.
- G. <u>Amendment</u>. The Agreement may be amended or an alternative form of the Agreement adopted only upon written agreement and approval of the governing bodies of all Parties.

 Amendments to this Agreement shall be filed with the Department of State, the Office of

the Great Seal, each county of the State where a Party is located, and any other governmental agency, office, and official required by law. The undersigned unit of local government or public agency hereby adopts, subscribes, and approves this Agreement to which this signature page will be attached, and agrees to be a party and be bound by the terms.

- H. <u>Compliance with Law.</u> The Association shall comply with all federal and State laws,
 rules, regulations, and orders applicable to this Agreement.
- I. No Third Party Beneficiaries. Except as expressly provided herein, this Agreement does not create, by implication or otherwise, any direct or indirect obligation, duty, promise, benefit, right of indemnification (i.e., contractual, legal, equitable, or by implication) right of subrogation as to any Party's rights in this Agreement, or any other right of any kind in favor of any individual or legal entity.
- J. <u>Counterpart Signatures</u>. This Agreement may be signed in counterpart. The counterparts taken together shall constitute one (1) agreement.
- K. <u>Permits and Licenses</u>. Each Party shall be responsible for obtaining and maintaining, throughout the term of this Agreement, all licenses, permits, certificates, and governmental authorizations for its employees and/or agents necessary to perform all its obligations under this Agreement. Upon request, a Party shall furnish copies of any permit, license, certificate or governmental authorization to the requesting party.
- L. <u>No Implied Waiver.</u> Absent a written waiver, no fact, failure, or delay by a Party to pursue or enforce any rights or remedies under this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of those rights with regard to any existing or subsequent breach of this Agreement. No waiver of any term, condition, or provision of this Agreement, whether by conduct or otherwise, in one or more instances shall be deemed or construed as a continuing waiver

of any term, condition, or provision of this Agreement. No waiver by either Party shall subsequently affect its right to require strict performance of this Agreement.

M. <u>Notices</u>. Notices given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered, sent by express delivery service, certified mail, or first class U.S. mail postage prepaid to the person appointed to the governing board by the governing body of the participating agency.

SUBJECT: Revenue and Expense Financial Reports for April 2018

Please find attached the April revenue and expense financial reports.

General Fund

Revenue

Year to date revenues were \$6,012,781 as of the end of April. The City has earned 78% of its budget, and completed 83% of the fiscal year. As we approach the end of the fiscal year, you will begin to see the difference between the budget and actual get smaller.

Expenditures

Year to date expenses were \$5,789,326 as of the end of April. The City has spent 76% of its budget, and completed 83% of the fiscal year. Most departments are spending below or at budget. A few departments are slightly over mostly due to timing of payments. Below are explanations for departments that are well over budget.

- Building and Grounds is over budget because of the restoration of the floors and the
 replacement of carpet. Since this is a large expense and the budget comparison is based on
 expenses being spend equally over 12 months, this large one-time expense will create a
 budget variance until the end of the fiscal year.
- General Administration had a larger bad debt expense from ambulance billing that anticipated. An additional budget amendment maybe needed.

Major and Local Streets

Year to date revenues will be lower than budgeted throughout the year for these funds. The state pays gas and weight tax (the major revenue source for these funds) two month in arrears. Also, a transfer will be made in May from the Capital Improvement Streets Fund to the Major Streets Fund to cover the road expenses.

Historical Commission

The City contributes \$33,000 to this fund to cover part of wages and any maintenance expenses for the castle. All other expense will be covered by either rental income for the Gould House or from donations. The City has pledged to pay for the cost to restore several paintings. In the past the restoration costs were paid as they were incurred as a transfer from the General Fund. However, going forward these expenses will be paid directly from the General Fund; as they are assets of the City not the Historical Commission. There is no effect on the Historical Commission due to this change, as the restoration was not budgeted.

At year end, a review of the General Fund transfer compared to the approved wages, and maintenance expense is performed and the General Fund transfer is either increased or decreased.

Sewer/Water/Wastewater Funds

Revenues

Year to date revenues will almost always be lower than budgeted throughout the year, as billing is done quarterly and always billed in arrears.

Expenditures

Sewer and Waste Water Funds are spending below budget. The Water Fund is spending higher than budget because the automatic meter reading equipment is being expensed between last fiscal year and the current fiscal year. However, the funding of the project was received last year. Therefore, previous year's fund balance will be used to offset the cost in the current fiscal year.

Fleet Fund

The Fleet Fund is spending below budget because only a small amount of capital purchases have been made.

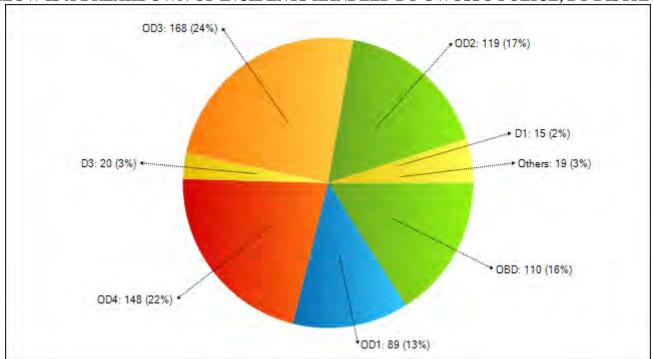

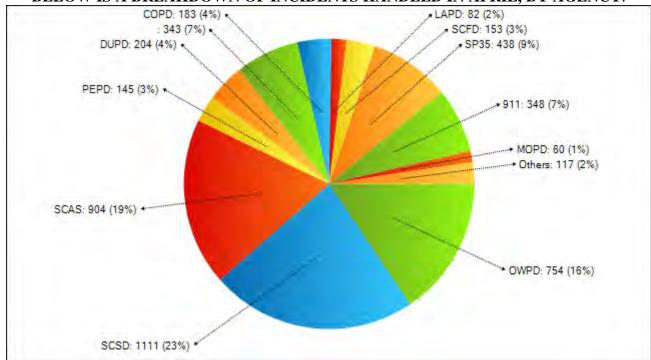
