# RE: Request Using ARPA Funds for Improving Parking Lot in Curwood Castle Park

Dear Owosso City Manager Nathan Henne,

The Shiawassee Arts Center is excited to be making plans to celebrate SAC's 50th Anniversary next year. We will be presenting a special 14-week exhibit on the History of Owosso, May 6 - August 14, 2022. This free exhibit will be a major event in our community and we plan to offer guided tours to school children who will be bussed in from the elementary and middle schools. Many additional events will take place at the Arts Center during this exhibition including two opening receptions, a Plein Aire event in the park, an Antiques Roadshow Appraisal event, and a series of talks on Owosso's history, plus a number of lunches and receptions recognizing SAC's many volunteers and supporters over the past 50 years.

In addition to SAC's current and upcoming events and activities, many other events take place in and around Curwood Castle Park. The Curwood Festival, Amphitheater concerts, Historic Home Tour, Moonlight Market, motorcoach tours and the Labor Day Walk draw hundreds of residents and visitors to the park. Also, the Miner Walkway and the planned kayak launch just across the river, will draw even more people to this premier park in downtown Owosso. And, of course, Curwood Castle is a major draw for visitors from outside the area (the Detroit Free Press once wrote that it is the 7th most visited historic site in the state of Michigan).

A paved and lit parking lot would truly benefit both local residents and the increasing number of visitors. It would also benefit the city in terms of liability. Several visitors to the park have fallen on the gravel parking lot. One woman broke her glasses and her nose. Another time a historical commission member, attending an evening meeting, had his windshield broken.


The Parks & Recreation Commission included paving the parking lot in its Master Plan for 2020 (please see attached 5-year capital improvement plan re Curwood Castle Park and map of the parking lot). Also attached is an August 5, 2021 estimate to pave the entire 12,500sq.ft. parking lot for \$55,995. The bid is considerably less than the city's estimated cost of \$200,000 (note: this is the same company that paved the parking spaces in front of the Castle two years ago.)


The SAC Board of Directors respectfully requests that the parking lot be paved and lighted using funds from the American Recue Plan Act. Thank you very much for your consideration.


