Shiawassee County Finances

Shiawassee County Commission Chairman Greg Brodeur gave a presentation regarding the state of the County's finances saying the amount of unfunded pension liabilities is very serious and will eventually lead to bankruptcy if nothing is done. He said the County is looking into bonding as a possible means of rectifying the situation. He said, he personally would like to see any money freed up by ARPA funds to be used toward said pension liability, but he is unaware of how other Commissioners would feel about the idea. He indicated he is available to talk at any time if anyone has questions.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Ordinance Amendment – Chapter 33, Traffic and Motor Vehicles

The proposed amendment would prohibit parking by non-electric vehicles in electric vehicle charging stations.

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment regarding the proposed amendment to Chapter 33, <u>Traffic and Motor Vehicles</u>, Article III, *Parking, Stopping and Standing*, Division 1, <u>Parking in Business Districts</u>, Secs. 33-37 & 33-38.

The following people commented regarding the proposed amendment:

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, said electric vehicles are quiet and don't pollute, and people need a place to plug them in.

Dave Acton, 106 N. Washington Street, fully supports the City's installation of two electric vehicle charging stations, indicating the project lines up with the Master Plan.

Seeing there were no more comments to be made, the Mayor closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Pidek asked what kind of signage would be installed and what phone number people should call if they see someone illegally parked in a charging station. City Manager Nathan R. Henne noted that the charging stations will have message boards capable of showing any helpful messages the City chooses. Public Safety Director Kevin D. Lenkart indicated that people can call the non-emergency number to report violations of the ordinance and the situation will be handled like any other parking ticket.

Whereas, the Council, after due and legal notice, has met and having heard all interested parties, motion by Mayor Pro-Tem Osika that the following ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 825

AMENDING SECS. 33-37 & 33-38 OF CHAPTER 33, <u>TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES</u>, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REGULATE PARKING IN ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, has a parking ordinance that does not include regulations for parking in electric vehicle charging stations; and

WHEREAS, an electric vehicle charging station is planned for Main Street Plaza; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to amend the parking ordinance to include regulations for said stations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on the proposed amendment November 15, 2021, heard all interested persons, and deliberated on the request.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THE CITY OF OWOSSO ORDAINS THAT:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. That Sec. 33-37, <u>Definitions</u>, of Article III, *Parking, Stopping and Standing*, Division 1, <u>Parking in Business Districts</u>, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso be amended as follows:

(a) Unless the context specifically indicates otherwise, the meanings of terms used in this division shall be as follows:

Business districts means and includes the downtown business district and the westown business district.

Downtown business district means and includes all that area bounded on the north by Williams Street, on the east by Park Street, and on the west and south by the Shiawassee River, including both sides of all streets referenced as boundary streets within this definition.

Electric vehicle means a fully electric automobile or hybrid gas and electric automobile.

Electric vehicle charging station means a public or private parking space that is served by battery charging station equipment that has as its primary purpose the transfer of electric energy by conductive or inductive means to a battery or other energy storage device in an electric vehicle equipped with level 2 or better charging equipment. An electric vehicle charging station may be counted as a parking space in the calculation of the parking spaces required by this Code.

Parking means and includes parking, stopping and standing as those terms are defined in the Uniform Traffic Code.

Parking lot means an area of land, whether or not improved, controlled by the city and available for use by the general public for the purpose of parking vehicles.

Westown business district means and includes all that area bounded on the north by a line one hundred ninety-eight (198) feet north of the north line of Main Street, on the east by Cedar Street, on the west by State Street and on the south by a line one hundred thirty-two (132) feet south of the south line of Main Street, including both sides of all streets referenced as boundary streets within this definition.

(b) Unless the context specifically indicates otherwise, terms other than those defined in section 33-37(a) shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Uniform Traffic Code.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. That Sec. 33-38, <u>Parking in designated space</u>, **of** Article III, *Parking, Stopping and Standing*, Division 1, <u>Parking in Business Districts</u>, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso be amended as follows:

Vehicles parked in the business districts defined in this division shall park within spaces designated for that purpose.

Public use charging stations shall be reserved for parking and charging of electric vehicles only. Electric vehicles may be parked in any space designated for parking subject to the restrictions that would apply to any other vehicle that would park in that space.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective December 6, 2021.

SECTION 4. AVAILABILITY. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the city clerk's office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Dave Acton, 106 N. Washington Street, addressed the proposed public hearings for the tax abatements on the Wesener Building thanking the Council for the extra time he was given to rectify the job creation requirement for the project. He indicated he has a new tenant in one of the storefronts of the building and they already have plans to expand. He said a timeline to correct the problem has been established and he will be bringing people to the December 6th meeting to provide credibility to the plans.

Eddie Urban, 601 Glenwood Avenue, noted if there are any Veterans that need help they can go to the Capitan Building on Wednesday, November 17th at 3:00p.m. for a meeting regarding available resources.

Jeff Turner, 204 Oakwood Avenue, asked for an update on the alley, fence and tree issues he pointed out near his house, specifically asking if the fence would be removed by the time it snows. Mayor Eveleth indicated the DPW is aware of his concerns and has them on their list of things to do. The items Mr. Turner listed that are related to Code Enforcement have been forwarded to the Building Department and notices have been sent to the property owners that are in violation.

Mayor Pro-Tem Osika provided an update on the electric vehicle charging stations saying they have been installed, Consumers Energy is scheduled to connect them by the end of the week, and Future Energy will be guiding the City through the process of getting them up and running.

Mayor Eveleth welcomed the City's new Main Street Manager Beth Kuiper.

Surface Transportation Program Fund Application - Stewart Street. BACKGROUND:

In 2013, an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Certificate was approved for 104-108 N Washington St – known as the Wesener Building. This OPRA was approved for 12 years as incentive to redevelop the property after a fire. The certificate was approved based on an application submitted by the developer promising to spend over \$2 million on the project and create 12 jobs. The construction was completed but the jobs were never created. The city's tax abatement policy assigned the maximum number of years for the tax incentive based on the cost and the jobs to be created.

RECOMMENDATION:

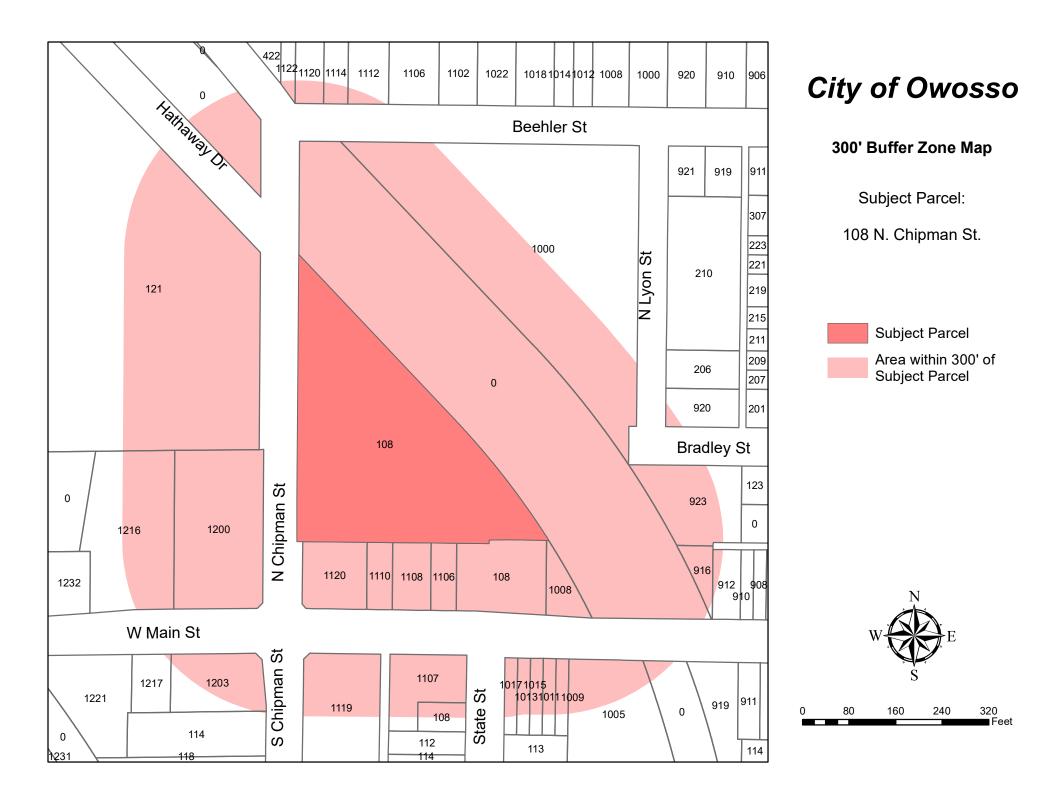

At your request, we have reviewed the above application from the City of Owosso to rezone 3 acres from B-3 Commercial to I-1, Light Industrial. The property is currently being split into two parcels, one with frontage on W. Main and the other with frontage on Chipman. This property was originally zoned industrial and was rezoned to B-3 in the past 5 years. The applicant will keep the B-3 zoning on the parcel fronting along W. Main.

Our comments are based on a review of the information submitted by the applicant, a site visit, meetings with the applicant, discussions with the Planning Commission, and conformance to the City's Master Plan and Zoning Ordinance. In reaching a decision on the application, the Planning Commission should consider our comments along with those from other staff and consultants, relevant input from the public, additional information provided by the applicant, and your own findings based on ordinance standards as part of your deliberation and recommendation to City Council.

LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

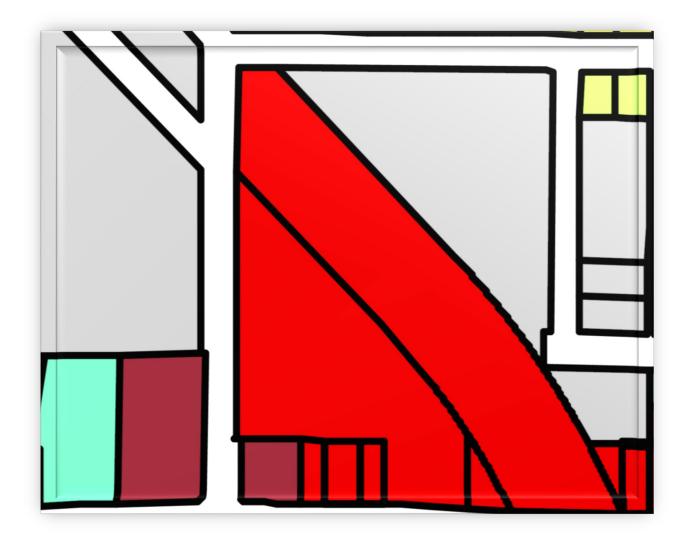
The subject parcel is located along the east side of N. Chipman Street, adjacent to the rail line. The property is identified in the draft master plan as an area for redevelopment but did not specifically state what redevelopment should be. The applicant would like to potentially locate a marijuana growing facility on this property.

DISCUSSION

In considering any petition for an amendment to the official zoning map, the planning commission and city council shall consider the following criteria in making its findings, recommendations and decision:

1. Consistency with the goals, policies, and future land use map of the City of Owosso Master Plan. If conditions upon which the master plan was developed (such as market factors, demographics, infrastructure, traffic and environmental issues) have changed significantly since the master plan was adopted, as determined by the city, the planning commission and council shall consider the consistency with recent development trends in the area.

Finding – While the current future land use map identifies this area as commercial, this property was previously industrial, and a marijuana grow facility would not be considered too intense for the surrounding commercial uses.

2. Compatibility of the site's physical, geological, hydrological, and other environmental features with the host of uses permitted in the proposed zoning district.

Finding – <u>This site would be compatible with the host of uses permitted under the I-1 Zoning</u> <u>Classification</u>.

3. Evidence the applicant cannot receive a reasonable return on investment through developing the property with at least one (1) use permitted under the current zoning.

Finding – <u>To our knowledge, no evidence exists showing that the applicant could not receive a</u> reasonable return on investment through developing the property as commercial.

4. The compatibility of all the potential uses allowed in the proposed zoning district with surrounding uses and zoning in terms of land suitability, impacts on the environment, density, nature of use, traffic impacts, aesthetics, infrastructure and potential influence on property values.

Finding – <u>It is our belief that land uses within the I-1 district are more compatible with this site</u> given former industrial uses on this site and the proximity to the rail line.

5. The capacity of the city's infrastructure and services sufficient to accommodate the uses permitted in the requested district without compromising the "health, safety, and welfare."

Finding – <u>There should be no issues with existing infrastructure being able to accommodate and service this site.</u>

6. The apparent demand for the types of uses permitted in the requested zoning district in relation to the amount of land currently zoned and available to accommodate the demand.

Finding – We find that there is high demand for industrial property in Owosso for potential marijuana grow facilities. There is already an approved facility across the street on Hathaway Drive and this site makes sense to revert back to its industrial nature.

7. The request has not previously been submitted within the past one (1) year, unless conditions have changed, or new information has been provided.

Finding – This application has not been previously before the City.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the above comments, we recommend approval of the rezoning request for 108 N.

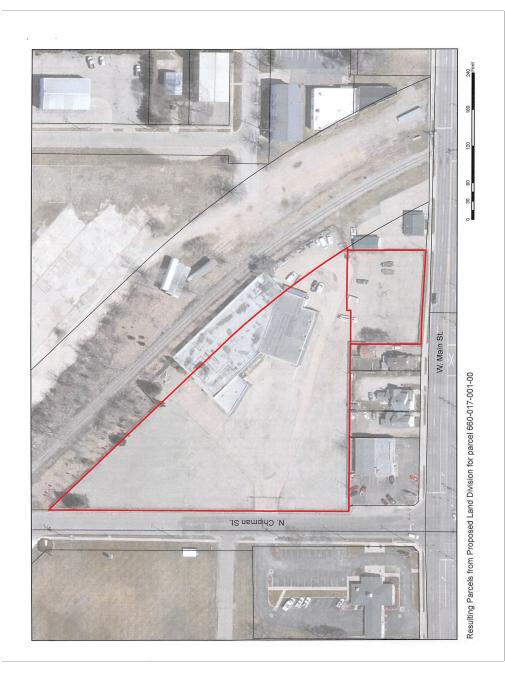

Dear Council Members,

I read in the Argus the article regarding a future grow facility: I urge you to consider what a grow facility has caused in Chesaning and other communities across the country: GROW FACILITIES CAUSE BAD ODOR! Residents are complaining. Odors are degrading quality of life in Chesaning. We do not want that to happen to Owosso!

A friend described a recent furniture delivery to her Chesaning home. The driver got out and asked, "What stinks?" She told him it was the marijuana facility. His comment? "That smells awful? You have to deal with that every day? I would never want to live here."

Her experience is not unique. The Chesaning Village Council has been hearing from citizens for many months regarding the odor. Please take note of these disturbing comments:

• The smell is daily and we complain often. Our garage smells of marijuana.

•We have a strong smell **of marijuana at Big Rock school.** I have called in complaints several times. Two days later I call back and they do nothing. What is the process, continue to call? How many people have called? My entire home smells like it.

•Our friends and neighbors are talking about moving if they can afford it.

•High Life agreed to install an odor monitor months ago. On Easter Sunday, my wife and I took a bike ride and smelled marijuana the whole way.

•Two years ago, we were told the odor would be sent into the atmosphere.

•The marijuana developers appear to be free to do what they want with no accountability.

•We came to Chesaning to live in someplace quiet and not have to deal with skunk smell.

•For those who live upwind of grow facilities, buffering criteria may not seem very important; but for those who live nearby or have respiratory issues, there is a point where good health is more important than financial gain.

Clearly, the so-called mitigation procedures have done nothing to stop this odor problem. The council ignores the pleas of the citizens, seemingly only concerned about money generated from these facilities. MONEY is not all a community needs! CLEAN, FRESH air should matter more. I hope OUR council will be more aware of the odor problem, as homeowners (taxpayers) deserve our viewpoints to be considered.

Countless articles from other cities tell the same story. Facilities get "cited" for odor, but ... it continues to be an issue. The best way to avoid the issue is to NOT HAVE the facility in the city to begin with.

The City of Owosso adopted the Small Cell Wireless Facilities Ordinance No. 813 on November 2, 2020 to allow for these types of facilities. The City of Owosso also updated its Fee Schedule to reflect the permit fees for small cell wireless facilities.

The applicant has submitted the required documents. City staff has reviewed the application and recommends approval of the plans and permit application from Cellco Partnership dba Verizon Wireless for the colocation of a small cell wireless facility on an existing Consumers Energy utility pole on West King Street.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The City receives a \$1,000 administration review fee plus a fee for each small cell wireless facility (range from \$200 to \$1,000 each) for a permit application and up to \$125 per year renewal on each small cell facility.

1. Rezoning Request – PREZ 2021-05 JABB MANAGEMENT – 108 N Chipman Street

Planning & Building Director Tanya Buckelew explained the property was originally zoned industrial but was rezoned to B-3 in 2012 due to being combined with W. Main Street frontage. A lot split was approved at the 11/01/2021 City Council meeting. There is now one lot with frontage on W. Main Street and this lot with frontage on N. Chipman Street. The applicant will keep the B-3 zoning on the parcel fronting along W. Main Street. The applicant is requesting 108 N. Chipman Street be rezoned back to I-1 Light Industrial for the purpose of a marihuana grow facility.

Opened the Public Hearing at: 6:35 pm

The following commented:

Eugene and Dee Riley of 1106 Beehler Street objected to the rezoning and use of 108 N. Chipman being used as a marihuana grow facility. Concerned about potential smell and deterioration of property value in the area.

Travis Prince of 1203 W. Main Street objected to the rezoning and use of 108 N. Chipman being used as a marihuana grow facility.

The City received a letter from Julie Wenzlick of 1101 Riverside Drive regarding grow facilities in Owosso and the odor that exists in Chesaning.

Adam Bronson, owner of 108 N. Chipman Street, explained if rezoned to industrial his plans for the building are an allowable use, offered explanation on odor control.

Closed the Public Hearing at: 6:40 pm

Planning & Building Director Tanya Buckelew briefly explained the city ordinance and that outdoor grow is not allowed in the City and strict adherence to odor control is provided for in the ordinance.

Chairman Wascher expressed concern on adding more industrial zones in the City of Owosso, Commissioner Robertson agreed.

Commissioner Law commented in support to this rezoning and wants to see the building occupied.

The following review is from Justin Sprague, City Planner with CIB Planning:

The subject parcel is located along the east side of N. Chipman Street, adjacent to the rail line. The property is identified in the draft master plan as an area for redevelopment but did not specifically state what redevelopment should be. The applicant would like to potentially locate a marijuana growing facility on this property.

In considering any petition for an amendment to the official zoning map, the planning commission and city council shall consider the following criteria in making its findings, recommendations, and decision:

- Consistency with the goals, policies, and future land use map of the City of Owosso Master Plan. If conditions upon which the master plan was developed (such as market factors, demographics, infrastructure, traffic and environmental issues) have changed significantly since the master plan was adopted, as determined by the city, the planning commission and council shall consider the consistency with recent development trends in the area. <u>Finding – While the current future land use map identifies this area as commercial, this</u> <u>property was previously industrial, and a marijuana grow facility would not be</u> <u>considered too intense for the surrounding commercial uses.</u>
- Compatibility of the site's physical, geological, hydrological, and other environmental features with the host of uses permitted in the proposed zoning district.
 <u>Finding This site would be compatible with the host of uses permitted under the I-1</u>
 <u>Zoning Classification.</u>
- 3. Evidence the applicant cannot receive a reasonable return on investment through developing the property with at least one (1) use permitted under the current zoning.

Finding – To our knowledge, no evidence exists showing that the applicant could not receive a reasonable return on investment through developing the property as commercial.

4. The compatibility of all the potential uses allowed in the proposed zoning district with surrounding uses and zoning in terms of land suitability, impacts on the environment, density, nature of use, traffic impacts, aesthetics, infrastructure and potential influence on property values.

<u>Finding – It is our belief that land uses within the I-1 district are more compatible with</u> this site given former industrial uses on this site and the proximity to the rail line.

- The capacity of the city's infrastructure and services sufficient to accommodate the uses permitted in the requested district without compromising the "health, safety, and welfare." <u>Finding – There should be no issues with existing infrastructure being able to</u> <u>accommodate and service this site.</u>
- 6. The apparent demand for the types of uses permitted in the requested zoning district in relation to the amount of land currently zoned and available to accommodate the demand. Finding We find that there is high demand for industrial property in Owosso for potential marijuana grow facilities. There is already an approved facility across the street on Hathaway Drive and this site makes sense to revert back to its industrial nature.
- The request has not previously been submitted within the past one (1) year, unless conditions have changed, or new information has been provided.
 <u>Finding – This application has not been previously before the City.</u>

Based upon the above comments, we recommend approval of the rezoning request for 108 N. Chipman based on the following items:

- 1. That the request is not in overwhelming conflict with the Master Plan or the Zoning Ordinance;
- 2. The site is compatible with uses in the proposed I-1 Zoning District;
- 3. The applicant is not rezoning to increase the return on investment of the property;
- 4. That the Planning Commission understands that the proposed use may be more compatible with surrounding land uses;
- 5. Infrastructure to the site is appropriate for the proposed use; and
- 6. The request has not been previously submitted to the City for consideration.
