Ordinance Amendment - Chapter 32, Taxation

City Manager Henne noted this amendment included minor language changes and had been reviewed and approved by Attorney Gould. The number of units is increasing from 50 to 53.

A public hearing was conducted to receive citizen comment regarding the proposed amendment to Chapter 32, <u>Taxation</u>, Article III, *Service Charge in Lieu of Taxes for Certain Housing Developments* of the Code of Ordinances.

There were no citizen comments received prior to, or during the meeting.

Whereas, the Council, after due and legal notice, has met and there being no one to be heard, motion by Mayor Pro-Tem Osika that the following amendment to Chapter 32, <u>Taxation</u>, Article III, Service Charge in Lieu of Taxes for Certain Housing Developments be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 842

APPROVING AMENDMENT TO DIVISION 2, <u>VENTURE RIVERVIEW FLATS, LDHA</u> OF CHAPTER 32, <u>TAXATION</u>, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO AMEND THE PILOT AGREEMENT FOR THE RIVERVIEW FLATS

WHEREAS, the Owosso Public Schools sold the former middle school building to Venture, Inc., a Michigan domestic nonprofit corporation, located in Pontiac, Michigan; and

WHEREAS, Venture, Inc., plans to convert the building into a mixed-use development with residential spaces catering to people with low incomes funded in part by low-income housing tax credits; and

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso agrees to forego property tax payments on the property to assist in the financial feasibility of the project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Owosso previously amended this ordinance on September 19, 2022, and after working with the State of Michigan and the developers, additional amendments were required to said ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on November 20, 2023, heard all interested persons, and deliberated on the proposed ordinance amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CITY OF OWOSSO, SHIAWASSEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS THAT:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Division 2, <u>Venture Riverview Flats LDHA LP</u>, of Article III, *Service Charge in Lieu of Taxes for Certain Housing Developments*, of Chapter 32, <u>Taxation</u>, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Owosso shall be amended to read as follows:

DIVISION 2. -VENTURE RIVERVIEW FLATS, LDHA LP

Sec. 32-50. - Preamble.

It is acknowledged that it is a proper public purpose of the State of Michigan and its political subdivisions to provide housing for its citizens of low income and to encourage the development of such housing by providing for a service charge in lieu of property taxes in accordance with the State Housing Development Authority Act of 1966 (1966 PA 346. as amended, MCL 125.1401 et seq.). The City is authorized by this Act to establish or change the service charge to be paid in lieu of taxes by any or all classes of housing exempt from taxation under this Act at any amount it chooses not to exceed the taxes that would be paid but for this Act.

It is further acknowledged that such housing for persons of low income is a public necessity, and as the City will be benefited and improved by such housing, the encouragement of the same by providing certain real estate tax exemption for such housing is a valid public purpose; further, that the continuance of the provisions of this article for tax exemption and the service charge in lieu of taxes during the periods contemplated in this article are essential to the determination of economic feasibility of housing developments which are constructed and financed in reliance on such ordinance and service charge.

The City further acknowledges that Venture, Inc., a domestic nonprofit corporation (a sponsor). has offered, subject to receipt of a mortgage loan from the authority, to erect and/or reuse an existing structure, own and operate a housing development Identified as Riverview Flats on certain property located at 219 N. Water Street (see legal description below) in the City to serve persons of low income,

and that the sponsor has offered to pay the City on account of the development an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all taxes.

The City further acknowledges that Venture, Inc., a Michigan domestic nonprofit corporation, has offered, subject to receipt of low-income housing tax credits from the authority, to erect, own and operate the development to the required standards of SHPO, identified as the Riverview Flats on certain property located at 219 N. Water Street in the City, hereinafter referred to as the "Site" and further described as:

to serve persons of low income, and that the sponsor has offered to pay the City on account of the development an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all taxes.

Sec. 32-51. - Definitions.

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly Indicates a different meaning:

Act means the State Housing Development Authority Act. being Public Act 346 of 1966, of the State of Michigan, as amended.

Annual Rents means the total collections during an agreed annual period from all tenants representing rents or occupancy charges exclusive of charges for gas, electricity, heat, or other utilities furnished to the tenants.

Authority means the Michigan State Housing Development Authority.

Housing development means a development which contains a significant element of housing for elderly persons of low income or persons of low income and such elements of other housing, commercial, recreational, industrial, communal, and educational facilities as the authority determines improve the quality of the development as it relates to housing for persons of low income.

HUD means the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Mortgage loan means a loan that is Federally-Aided (as defined in Section 11 of the Act) or loan or grant made or to be made by the Authority, for the construction, rehabilitation, acquisition and/or permanent financing of a housing project, and secured by a mortgage on the housing project.

Low income Persons and Families means persons and families eligible to move into a housing development project who fall within income limitations set in this act or by the authority in its rules.

Sponsor means persons or entities that receive or assume a Mortgage Loan.

State Historic Preservation Office means The Michigan State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) helps property owners, developers, and local and state agencies recognize and seize opportunities to maintain and rehabilitate structures that define communities and define Michigan. The SHPO encourages the rehabilitation of historic buildings so they can continue to

enrich communities where people want to live and visit. Through the protection of historic and archaeological sites and other cultural resources, preservation provides a record of Michigan's history and creates a link between Michigan's residents: past, present, and future.

Utilities means fuel, water, sanitary sewer service and/or electrical service which are paid by the housing development.

Sec. 32-52. - Class of housing developments.

It is determined that the class of housing developments to which the tax exemption shall apply and for which a service charge shall be paid in lieu of such taxes shall be multiple dwellings for persons of low income and any social, recreational, commercial and communal facilities as may be necessary to serve residents of the housing development and the area in which it is located, which are financed or assisted by the authority, or which have a federally aided mortgage, as defined in the Act. It is determined that Riverview Flats is of this class.

Sec. 32-53. - Establishment of annual service charge for Riverview Flats.

The housing development identified as Riverview Flats and the property on which it shall be constructed shall be exempt from all property taxes from and after the commencement of construction. The City, acknowledging that the sponsor and the authority have established the economic feasibility of the housing development in reliance upon the enactment and continuing effect of this article and the qualification of the housing development for exemption from all property taxes and a payment in lieu of taxes as established herein, and in consideration of the sponsor's offer, subject to receipt of a mortgage loan, to construct, own and operate the housing development, hereby agrees to accept payment of an annual service charge for public services in lieu of all ad valorem property taxes. The annual service charges shall be equal to four (4) percent of the difference between annual rents actually collected and utilities.

Sec. 32-54. – Payment of service charge.

The service charge in lieu of taxes as determined under this article shall be payable in the same manner as general property taxes are payable to the City except that the annual payment shall be paid on or before March 31 of each year.

Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, should the Sponsor fail to pay the final adjusted service charge in lieu of taxes granted hereunder by the due date, or fail to submit along with the payment such financial information as is necessary to support the calculations used to make a payment, the City may determine that the Sponsor has violated the Ordinance and may then follow the collection procedures pursuant to the provisions of the General Property Tax Act (1893 PA 206. As amended; MCL 211.1, et seq) in order to collect the service charge.

Sec. 32-55. – Duration.

The tax exempt status of a housing development approved for such status by the City council shall remain in effect and shall not terminate so long as the mortgage loan for such housing development remains outstanding and unpaid, as long as the housing at the property is subject to restrictive rents in compliance with the low income housing tax credit program administered by MSHDA, or for such period as the authority or other governmental entity has any interest in the property; provided, the construction of such development commences within two (2) years from the effective date the City council approves the housing development for tax exempt status as provided in this article.

Sec. 32.56. - Contractual effect.

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 15a(5) of the Act (MCL 125.1415a(5)), to the contrary, a contract between the City and the sponsor with the authority as third part beneficiary thereunder, to provide tax exemption and accept payments In lieu thereof as previously described is effected by enactment of this article.

Sec. 32.57 – Severability.

The various sections and provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be severable, and should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any section or provision of this Ordinance, other than the section or provision so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

Sec. 32.58 - Inconsistent ordinances.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such consistency or conflict.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 3. AVAILABILITY. This ordinance may be purchased or inspected in the City Clerk's office, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective December 11, 2023.

CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Caroline Wilson, County Clerk, noted that her office is back in the Courthouse as remodeling is complete. She gave a brief update on Early Voting, highlighting that 20 of the 21 jurisdictions in the County have partnered for the host site at the Veterans Building. She spoke on CPL information and the Red Flag law. She distributed updated County directories.

Ed Urban, 601 Glenwood, urged Council to consider the repair of dangerous condensers on his street.

Tom Manke, 2910 W M-21, inquired about the cost of the City hosting its own 9-day Early Voting site and detailed the financial status of the country. He is concerned with future generations and the debt they will be saddled with as this generation seeks out grants.

Jeff Turner addressed the Council regarding the grading of the alley near his residence and his disappointment with the City's lack of response to his request.

Councilmember Law noted the absence of a pertinent traffic sign at Woodlawn and Monroe. It will be brought to the attention of the Engineering Department.

Councilmember Olson noted she was not present at the previous meeting where the sale of the Gould House was decided upon. She voiced her concerns regarding that decision stating it was duplicitous with regards to the 501(c)3 that had existed and her disappointment regarding the lack of a public hearing for the public to discuss the sale of property they were taxed for.

Mayor Teich and City Manager Henne assured Mr. Turner his concerns would be addressed.

2024 Poverty Exemption Policy, Guidelines and Thresholds

Please consider the attached resolution regarding the City's poverty exemption policy, income levels, and asset levels for 2024. This resolution continues the recent practice of using a blend of income thresholds between current Federal Poverty Guidelines and the Shiawassee County Median 40% Income, whichever threshold is higher (summarized below). I am also recommending an increase in asset thresholds to reflect inflation increases.

As per the provisions of Public Act 390 of 1994 and further amended by Public Act 620 of 2002, local governing bodies are required to set income levels for their poverty exemption guidelines, and those income levels **shall not** be set lower than the federal poverty guidelines as updated annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The act also requires an asset test to be a part of the policy and guidelines.

RESOLUTION NO.

CITY OF OWOSSO POVERTY EXEMPTION GUIDELINES FOR 2024

WHEREAS, the adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is within the purview of the City Council, and

WHEREAS, the homestead of persons who by reason of poverty are unable to contribute to the public charges is eligible for exemption in whole or part from taxation under Public Act 390, 1994(MCL 211.7u); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 390 of 1994, City of Owosso, Shiawassee County adopts the following guidelines for the Board of Review to implement. The guidelines shall include but not be limited to the specific income and asset levels of the applicant and all persons residing in the household; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Act 191 of 2023, if a person qualifies, the Board of Review shall grant either a 100%, 75%, 50% or 25% reduction in taxable value for the applicable tax year, or any other percentage reduction approved by the state tax commission. However, the City of Owosso elects to give only 100% reduction to approved applicants; and

To be eligible, a person shall do all the following on an annual basis:

- Be the owner and occupy the principal residence of the property for which an exemption is applied.
- Submit an application on the form provided by the State of Michigan, available through the City Assessor's office. The application constitutes an appearance before the Board of Review for the purpose of preserving the applicant's right to appeal.
- Provide proof of residency for <u>all</u> residents in the home.
- Supply a copy of federal and state income tax returns filed in the current year for <u>all adult residents</u> if available, or immediately preceding year if current is unavailable, and/or a signed affidavit stating income tax returns are not required to be filed (Treasury Form 4988).
- Supply copies of six-months-worth of income evidence for the previous year (pay stubs, benefit statement, etc.) for <u>all</u> residents 18 years old and over. Additional stubs may be requested later.
- If the applicant fails to supply <u>all</u> the required documents or if it is found that the information supplied is fraudulent, the application <u>shall be denied</u>.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Owosso City Council that the Board of Review shall follow the above stated policy and the below stated guidelines in granting or denying an exemption.

Applicant's income shall not exceed the poverty income thresholds listed here. Income of students under the age of 18 years shall **not** be included as income.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if asset levels exceed the items/amounts below, the individual/property owner shall **not be eligible for a Property Tax Poverty Exemption.**

- Assets (except the original homestead, essential household goods and the first \$9,100 of the market value of a motor vehicle), less what is owed on said vehicle, shall not exceed \$5,700 (five thousand seven hundred dollars) for individual applicant and/or \$8,000 (eight thousand dollars) per household if more than one financial contributor.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of increased payment for construction work by Sorensen Gross Company (Flint, MI) for the Palmer 3A and Juniper 1 Well Houses project in the amount of \$7,904.00.

BACKGROUND:

On January 17, 2023, the City received bids for the Palmer 3a and Juniper 1 Well Houses Project. Work includes construction of two (2) well houses, two (2) vertical line-shaft turbine pumps, water mains to connect water wells to existing raw water mains for the following wells:

- Palmer 3A
- Juniper 1

On February 6, 2023, City Council approve a resolution to tentatively award the Palmer 3A and Juniper 1 Well Houses Project contract to Sorensen Gross Company. As Sorensen Gross Company was the confirmed low and most responsive bid and agreed to perform the work for a total cost amount of \$2,363,238.00.

On August 21, 2023, City Council approved change order #1, for \$8,029.00 due to a location error by Engineering firm OHM, which caused the need for additional materials and labor which weren't initially planned for.

Now it has been recently discovered that unsuitable soils were present at the proposed location for the Palmer 3A well house, the contractor was required to remove the unsuitable soils and replace them with sound, compacted materials. The additional work and materials required totals \$7,904.00, which requires change order #2. OHM has reviewed the proposed change order and cost, and has found it to be fair and acceptable. EGLE has determined this change order is within the scope of the approved loan project.

This change increases the project cost by \$7,904.00, bringing the total project cost from \$2,371,267.00 to \$2,379,171.00. Project contingency funds are sufficient to cover the allowable costs of this change order.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The project is funded by the DWSRF and ARPA Funds, with the additional costs of \$7,904.00. Final expenses in the amount of \$2,379,171.00 shall be paid from the Water Fund and 2023 SRF Bond Funds.

Based upon the mutual promises below, the contractor and the city agree as follows:

ARTICLE I - Scope of work

This contract represents the entire understanding between the city and the contractor and it supersedes all prior representations or agreements whether written or oral. Neither party has relied on any prior representations in entering into this contract. 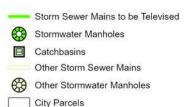

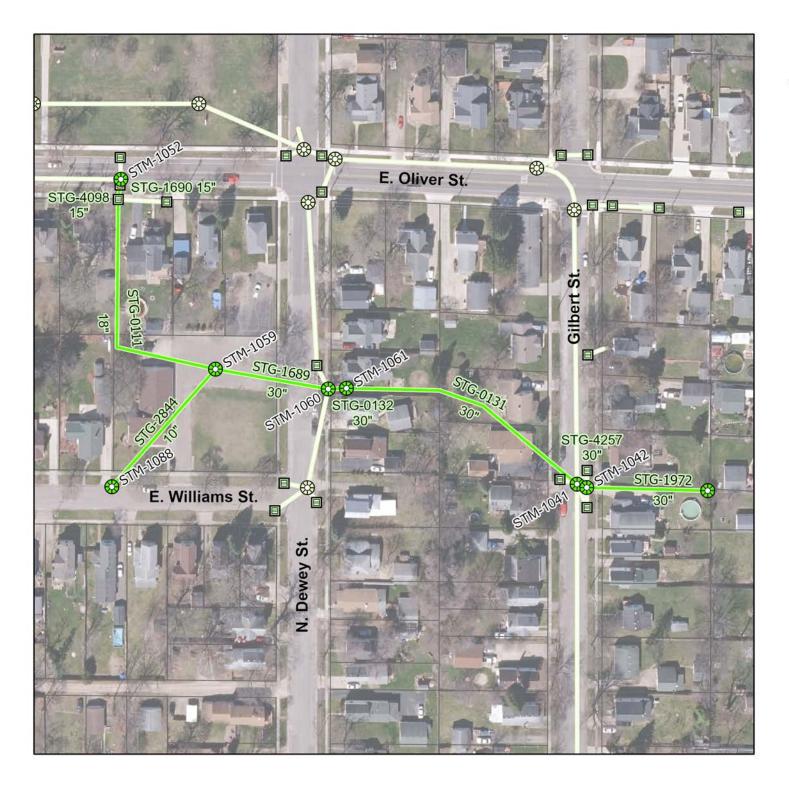

SUBJECT: Lift Stations - Control Cabinets Rehabilitation

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the proposal provided from Utilities Instrumentation Service Incorporated (UIS) of Dexter, Michigan for lift station control cabinets rehabilitation and installation of Cruise VT SCADA system.

BACKGROUND:

The Osburn Lakes, Wright St. and Palmer St. lift stations currently have no source of backup power in the event of a power outage. The Palmer St. and Osburn Lakes stations do have capability for connection to a trailer-mounted generator. However, the City does not have such a unit at its disposal, and procuring one in an emergency could be difficult. The Wright St. station has no ability to connect to a portable unit.

As the first step toward installing a permanent standby generator at each station, the existing control cabinets must be rehabilitated. Each cabinet contains wiring and elements of the different level sensing and alarm systems that have been installed over the years. Many of the mounted components are not currently in use or necessary. Once unnecessary pieces are removed, new electrical drawings may also need to be produced so the generator systems can be designed.

All stations currently run off a MultiTrode level sensing and pump control system (Kennedy Industries, Wixom, MI). The Palmer St. station also has a Cruise VT SCADA system (Utilities Instrumentation Service, Dexter, MI) for transmitting level, pump and alarm information wirelessly to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The existing Wright St. and Osburn Lakes station alarm system transmits to the Filtration Plant and has been historically unreliable. As part of the rehabilitation, we will be adding the Cruise transmitting system to the Wright St. and Osburn Lakes stations as well.

Due to the specialized nature of the Cruise systems, UIS is the only authorized dealer. UIS's quote for rehabilitation of the control cabinets and Cruise VT SCADA system installation is:

\$ 6,575.00 for the Palmer St. rehab

\$14,345.00 for the Wright St. rehab

\$13,775.00 for the Osburn Lakes rehab

\$34,695.00 TOTAL

UIS is a sole source provider for the Cruise VT SCADA system. Request waiver of purchasing policy formal bid requirements in order to initiate immediate procurement upon approval and authorization.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The budget for FY2023-24 has a total of \$97,500 toward the lift stations generator project, the above expenses in the amount of \$34,695.00 shall be paid from the Capital Outlay – Sewers account 590-901-973.000.

Team UIS shall not be liable for any delay or failure to perform any obligation under this Agreement if such delay or failure is caused by circumstances beyond its reasonable control, including, without limitation, acts of God or public authority, riots or other public disturbances, labor disputes of any kind, electrical or power outages, utilities or telecommunications failures, earthquake, storms or other elements of nature, acts or orders of government, pandemics, acts of terrorism or war, or acts by third parties, failure of Client to provide required information, or the change in cost or availability of raw materials, components or services based on market conditions, supplier actions or contract disputes ("Force Majeure Event"). During a Force Majeure Event, Team UIS's obligations under the Order Confirmation and any related purchase order shall be suspended and Team UIS shall not have any obligation to provide Client with Products or Services from other sources or to pay or reimburse Client for any additional costs to Client of obtaining substitute Products or Services, nor shall Team UIS be liable for any damages to Client arising from or related to a Force Majeure Event.
- 16. Governing law. The contract shall be governed by the laws of Michigan
- 17. Employee Solicitation. Employee Solicitation. Client agrees not to hire, attempt to hire, or retain as consultants or otherwise, employees and/or consultants of Team UIS directly or through a third-party entity during the employment or consulting period and for a period of one (1) year subsequent to the employee's and/or consultant's last day of work for Team UIS regardless of the circumstances surrounding employee's cause of termination of employment.
- 18. Indemnification. Client holds harmless, indemnifies, and will defend Team UIS and its related or affiliated entities including their respective officers, agents and employees against any claims, liabilities, expenses, charges, fines and related losses including attorney's fees and expenses to the extent directly or indirectly caused by Client's (including those acting on behalf of Client) (a) negligent acts of omissions and involving property damage or bodily injury; (b) breach of the terms of the Agreement between the parties; or (c) violation of applicable law. This provision shall apply even if there is concurrent negligence but shall not apply to property damage or bodily injury arising solely from Team UIS's negligence. Liability per above is not limited by limits of workers compensation coverage.
- 19. Survival/Entire Agreement/Waiver/Applicable Laws. These Terms shall survive and continue in full force and effect following the expiration, cancellation or termination of an Order Confirmation and any related purchase order. The Order Confirmation, including these Terms and any other attachments, exhibits or supplements specifically referenced in the Order Confirmation, constitutes the entire agreement between Team UIS and Client greements. Except the matters contained in the Order Confirmation and supersedes all prior oral or written representations and agreements. Except as otherwise provided in these Terms, the Order Confirmation may only be modified by a written representations and agreements. Except to the matters contained in the Order Confirmation of the Order Confirmation shall be effective only if in writing and signed by Team UIS, and shall not constitute a waiver of such terms as to any subsequent events or conditions, whether similar or dissimilar. No course of dealing or custom in the trade shall constitute a modification or waiver by Team UIS of any right. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Michigan, except for its choice of laws provisions.
- 20. Electronic Signature. THE CONTRACT MAY BE SIGNED OR ACCEPTED ELECTRONICALLY, CONVEYING CUSTOMER'S ACCEPTANCE. COMPLIANCE WITH THE CONTRACT THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, EMAIL ACKOWLEDGEMENT, AND CUSTOMER'S ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE WILL BE DEEMED VALID AND BINDING. IF CUSTOMER CONTESTS THE VALIDITY OF THE CONTRACT BASED ON THE MEANS OF ELECTRONIC OR OTHER FORM OF EXECUTION OR ACCEPTANCE BY THE PARTIES AND THE CONTRACT IS HELD BY A COURT OR ARBITRATOR TO BE VALID, THE CUSTOMER SHALL PAY THE ATTORNEYS' FEES AND EXPENSES OF TEAM UIS ARISING FROM THE CUSTOMER'S CONTEST OF THE CONTRACT'S VALIDITY.
- 21. Escalation. Any material that has been quoted as a part of this project is calculated based upon current prices. The market for these materials is volatile, and sudden price increases could occur. Team UIS agrees to use its best efforts to obtain the lowest prices price possible from our suppliers. However, should there be an increase in the price of materials that are purchased after the execution of contract Team UIS reserves the right to adjust the contract for the increase. Team UIS will provide timely written notice to the Client if this were to occur.
- 22. Postponement. In the event that the Client postpones the project, Team UIS reserves the right to charge the Client for costs incurred that will cause the project to exceed the original cost estimate. Team UIS will provide timely written notice to the Client if this were to occur.
- 23. Cancellation. In the event that the Client cancels the work once the work has been scheduled by Team UIS, Team UIS reserves the right to charge the Client as follows:

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund – Project No. 7497.01 Clean Water State Revolving Fund – Project No. 5919.01

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve two authorizing resolutions to publish Notices of Intent to issue revenue bonds to finance a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) project (7497.01) and a Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) (5919.01) project.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Owosso has been allocated funding by the state of Michigan revolving loan funds to make infrastructure improvements to its wastewater treatment plant, water distribution system and water treatment plant.

A Notice of Intent (NOI) to issue revenue bonds is necessary for each project per Public Act 94 of 1933. Such notice will begin a 45-day referendum period during which voters have the right to petition for a vote on the bonds.

The NOI for CWSRF funded Project No. 5919.01- WWTP secondary clarifier project will authorize a maximum bond principal of \$5,200,000. The state has agreed to purchase \$2,600,000 of the said bond's principal and provide an ARPA grant for \$2,600,000.

The NOI for DWSRF funded Project No. 7497.01 – watermain replacement, lead service line replacement and water treatment plant improvements, will authorize a maximum bond principal of \$3,490,000. The state has agreed to purchase \$1,867,500 of the said bond's principal and forgive \$122,500 of such principal. In addition, an ARPA grant for \$1,622,500 has been awarded by the state.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

CWRLF - Estimated debt payment (\$2.6M) of \$158,000 over 20 years at 2.0% from Fund 599 DWSRF - Estimated debt payment (\$1.745M) of \$106,000 over 20 years at 2.0% from Fund 591

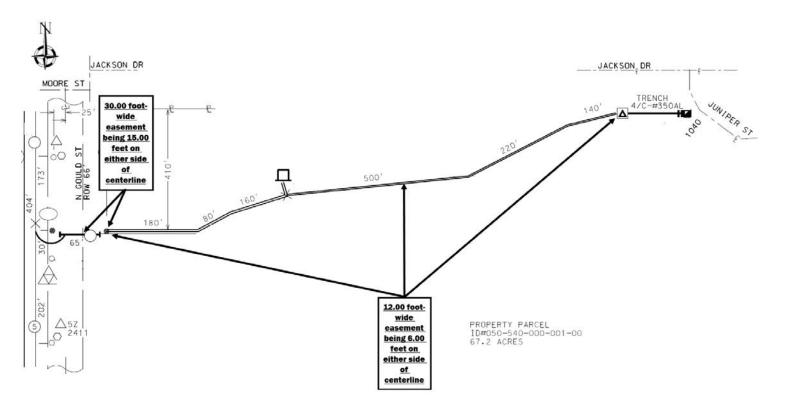

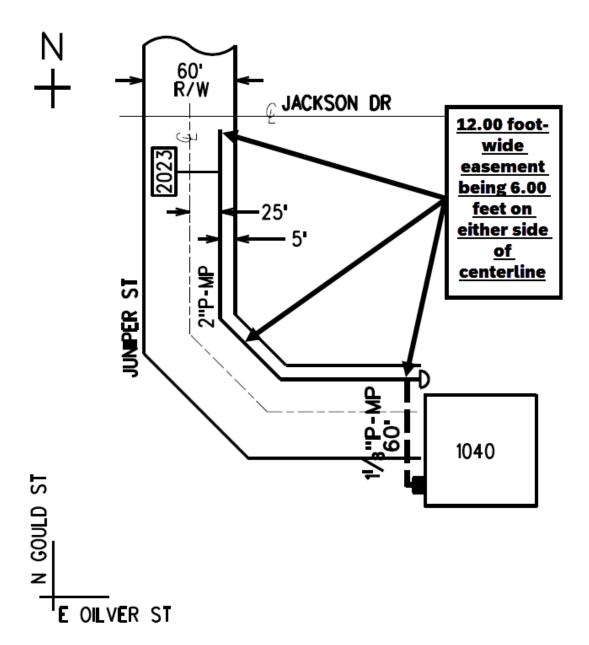

The Phase I Project is underway with work progressing at the expected pace so far.

 - 1. Utility Authority Plan Progress: Langtry updated the Board on the Owosso Township-Caledonia Township Utility Authority efforts toward H2S mitigation. Per vendor guidance, the chemical treatment dosage has been in increased and H2S logger data will be available next week. There was general discussion on the treatment dosage. Guysky noted the WWTP screening room H2S readings have been consistently zero for the last couple weeks. Langtry said he would be discontinuing the chemical feed at the end of November, as H2S conditions become less favorable in the winter months. The Utility

Authority continues to work with their consultants on a more permanent solution to the H2S problem.
