### 1. Bentley Park Review

Susan Montenegro, Assistant City Manager and Director of Community Development, reviewed some items about the Bentley Park: inspections are getting done; grants are being closed out by the end of March; and tables and benches will be placed by the splash pad. There was a discussion about security cameras and signs regarding the surveillance. It was mentioned the police department, insurance companies, and 911 should be consulted for further security information. Chairman Espich will be speaking with Chief Lenkart tomorrow.

### 2. Disc Golf Status

Chairman Espich commented that Pete Carsten, Baker College President, serves on the cemetery board where the disc gold course will be. He wants more information on how it will be maintained. Ian Granger and John Beebe are really busy right now with snow removal but are very excited to get going on the project.

#### 3. DIG - Curwood Castle Park

Ms. Montenegro described the Downtown Infrastructure Grant of \$695,000 that will be awarded on February 28 in the Council Chambers at 11:30 am. She invited the Parks and Recreation Commission to attend the ceremony as it will also involve areas around the Curwood Castle Park. They will be redoing the parking area by the Curwood Castle, join the CIS trail, and tie into the Armory project. They will also deconstruct the Chamber of Commerce building and move the roof to make a pavilion for the Farmer's Market. They will be working on the retaining walls and make stairs down to the bridge.

Ms. Montenegro suggested the commission check out a couple sites such as grants.gov and grant watch.

#### 4. Polar Plunge

Chairman Espich explained the last two years' history of the Polar Plunge to Ms. Montenegro. Commissioner Hathaway enthusiastically asked to take charge of this project. Discussion involved Jerry Hebekeuser and Ben Frederick helping out; a warming tent; needing about 15 people to jump; pledges made ahead of time; possibility of raising money by having people pay **not** to jump in; snacks; shirts; and a couple businesses were mentioned for refreshments / hot beverages. An organizational meeting will be scheduled the week of February 10 and the plunge may be scheduled March 15 or 22.




### Adjournment:

# OUR MISSION

To promote the creation of a safe, multi-use trail for non-motorized recreation, utilizing the former Central Michigan Railroad corridor between Ionia and Owosso, Michigan.

### WF ARF

The Friends' group was formed by an initiative of the Clinton Area Planning for Intergovernmental Teamwork (CAPIT) in the spring of 1999 to research the possibility of turning the Central Michigan Railroad corridor, unused since 1992, into a recreational trail.

# OUR ROLE

The role of the Friends of the Fred Meijer CIS Trail includes:

### ZAZ

Plans are in place for the trail to be part of the Midwest Regional Rail-Trail Network, joining up on the west end with three additional trails. This "super trail", made up of our trail, the Fred Meijer Clinton-lonia Shiawassee Trail, the Fred Meijer Grand River Valley Trail, the Fred Meijer Flat River Valley Trail, and the Fred Meijer Heartland Trail, will soon become the fifth longest rail-trail in the United States at 125 miles. It will be a notable tourism attraction for mid-Michigan as it travels along three different rivers, through two state game areas, and through 16 towns and villages, which, excluding the state game areas, are all spaced about 7 to 10 miles apart.

### (Ground) Breaking News - Rail-Trial Project Issued for Bid

Construction bidding for the Fred Meijer Clinton-Ionia-Shiawassee (CIS) Rail-Trail and the contract award are scheduled for early 2014. Once the weather breaks and contractors are able to mobilize, the long awaited construction for this \$5,280,000 rail-trail project will begin.

The entire state rail-trail from Ionia to Owosso will be under construction during 2014. Paved sections of asphalt surface will occur in each of the five communities along the route connected by 32 miles of crushed limestone surface. Bridge improvements are planned for nine structures located along the 42 mile route. Work will consist of restoration and repair prior to installing new bridge decking and handrails required for recreational trail use. 10% of the bridge maintenance cost (\$50,000) for this project is being funded by The Fred Meijer Mid-West Regional Rail-Trail Maintenance Endowment. Substantial project completion is expected in mid-November 2014!

**Community Support** 

The balance of the rail-trail project funding was secured in 2013. A special thank you is extended to the counties, townships, cities and villages who have contributed financial support for this project. The local community contribution accounts for just over 2% of the total cost. We would like to say **THANK YOU** to the local units of government who have said **YES** to this rail-trail project.

### Safety First

The Department of Natural Resources and the Friends ask for your cooperation during construction. Please stay **OFF** the rail-trail and allow contractors to complete all of their work and until all stop signs are installed at the road intersections. The rail-trail will be officially declared open to the public once construction has been completed and the trail is ready for your enjoyment.

#### **Look West**

Located immediately west another ten miles of state rail-trail, the Fred Meijer Grand River Valley Rail-Trail, is under construction. The two projects will connect on the east side of the City of Ionia at Prairie Creek. Construction from Saranac to Ionia (including four miles through the Ionia State Recreation Area) was completed, dedicated and open to the public November 2013. The remaining portion of the project which will include a pedestrian bridge over M-66 in Ionia, also scheduled for 2014 construction. When both projects are complete you will be able to travel uninterrupted from Saranac to Owosso.

### **News from the Mid-West Michigan Trail Authority**

As the winter months settle in, the Mid-West Michigan Trail Authority (MWMTA) continues its responsibilities concerning this rail trail system.

It is exciting to watch as more sections become developed. Bids have gone out for other sections and work should commence as spring nears.

Distribution and over-sight of the Fred Meijer Endowment dollars is one of the Authorities' main responsibilities. In regards to the budget, 2014 brings more focus on planning for long term maintenance, for example, bridges. There are more than 20 bridges within the 125 mile corridor. Also, as sections of the trail become developed, there are more legal type issues to deal with. For example, lease agreements, liability issues, and safety standards must be developed. All of this must be taken care of under the "administrative" category.

We have formed a committee on Minimum Standards. Each Friends group has appointed two members. As this group begins its work, we look forward to a document that sets standards for all to use so that we have a safe and sustainable trail system.

### **Bike Ride for the Railway**

In 2013 the Friends Group partnered with the Clinton County Arts Council for a very successful Bike Ride for the Railway. Sixty one riders showed up at the train depot in St. Johns on a beautiful fall Sunday in late September, coming from as far away as Kalamazoo, Ypsilanti, Albion, Reed City and Clinton Township. D&K Bikes donated advertisements, signage and food and water for the SAG stops and Main Street Cafe donated meals for all bicyclists as they finished the ride. The Friends of the FMCIS provided numerous volunteers and received a generous portion of the profits from the ride.

We are excited to announce that we will once again be partnering with the Clinton County Arts Council to host the third annual Bike Ride for the Railway to be held on Sunday, September 28, 2014! In 2014 the ride will feature a portion of the FMCIS Rail Trail between Scott Road and DeWitt Road in St. Johns (which may be completed by the date of the ride). Four routes will be available for all experience levels, ranging from a one to five mile loop to a sixty mile loop. As in the past, bicyclists will be supported by SAG drivers and SAG stops will be provided along the various routes with food, drinks and porta potties. Sparrow Clinton Hospital has agreed to underwrite a portion of the expenses. Arrangements for other corporate sponsors are in the works.

Michigan is fast becoming a destination place for bicycle rides and tours. So come join in the fun and raise \$\$'s for the trail!









### **Board Elections**
