Where and when to drop off?

- 1. CORUNNA Shiawassee County Sheriff Department Lobby 201 E. MacArthur Street, every day, all day
- 2. DURAND City Hall Lobby 215 W. Clinton Street, Monday through Friday, 9:00 am - 5:00 pm
- 3. OWOSSO Public Safety Department Lobby 202 South Water Street, every day, all day
- **4. PERRY City Hall Lobby** 203 W. Polly Street, Monday through Friday, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm

What can be disposed of?

- 1. All pills, loose or in pill bottles.
- 2. No liquids However, you may pour the liquid medication onto paper towels, let them air dry, seal them in a plastic bag and then they can be put into the Red Barrel.
- 3. No inhalers and no syringes.

All medication will be disposed of in an environmentally safe, EPA approved way. Pharmaceutical controlled substances ARE accepted including, but not limited to, OxyContin, Vicodin, and Percocet. No questions will be asked.

The barrels are funded through donations from the Kiwanis Club of Owosso and the Memorial Healthcare Foundation Community Health and Education Fund administered by the Shiawassee Community Foundation.
